Indiana CTE Career Guide

The 2022-2023 CTE Career Guide can be ordered through Tuesday, December 21 [at this link](#).

As shared in the last update, a **Spanish version of the career guide** is available for order this year. The online version of the Spanish guide is now complete and [can be seen here](#). The Spanish version contains all the same content, simply translated from the English version.

Both the English and Spanish version are available for [order here](#). The Career Guide is one of best ways to inform students, families, school counselors, CTE instructors, and others about Career and Technical Education in Indiana and we encourage all schools and career centers to consider acquiring some copies. The minimum order for English guides is 250. There is no minimum quantity for the Spanish version as long as an entity has ordered at least 250 copies of the English version.

Guides ordered by the 21st will be received in mid-January.

- **Special Orders:** A few entities have reached out regarding ordering an amount below the minimum order threshold (250) established by the vendor. In these circumstances we encourage schools to work with neighboring schools or their local career center to collaborate on an order. 2022-2023 CTE Course Funding Levels

The funding memo is produced by the Department of Workforce Development in collaboration with the Governor's Workforce Cabinet. The funding memo contains all Next Level Programs of Study courses and the previously existing courses that are still available in the upcoming school year.
