High School Pipeline and College Preparation


- 11% of high school graduates are Black
- The percentage of Black high school graduates has grown 2 percentage points in the last 10 years
- Roughly 70% of Black high school graduates come from a low-income household
- 39% of Black high schoolers earn AP or dual credit
- 18% of Black high school graduates earned an Academic Honors diploma




53% of Black high school graduates go straight to college. The statewide average is 61%

Early Success in College

Only 24% of Black students meet all three early college success metrics (no remediation; complete all attempted credits; persist to second year)




College-Going Rates by Socioeconomic Status

Black Students' Early Success In College






Black Students' On-Time Two-Year Institution Completion


Black Students' On-Time Four-Year Institution Completion




Black Students' Extended-Time Completion

On-Time Completion

- 6% of Black Hoosiers graduate from twoyear campuses on time
- 27% of Black Hoosiers graduate from fouryear campuses on time

Extended-Time Completion

 35% of Black Hoosiers graduate from college within 6 years (at both two- and four-year institutions)

Dual Credit and Completion

 Students who earned AP or dual credit in high school were more likely to graduate college on-time and to graduate at all
