Judges Sought for National Reading/Writing Contest

The Indiana Center for the Book is currently seeking judges for this year's Letters About Literature competition. Letters About Literature is a national reading-writing contest sponsored by

the Center for the Book in the Library of Congress, in cooperation with the Indiana Center for the Book, and in partnership with Target Stores. Students in grades 4 through 12 are invited to write a personal letter to an author, living or dead, from any genre, explaining how that author's work changed the student's way of thinking about the world or themselves. This program promotes reflective writing.

Approximately 1,500 Indiana students enter the contest annually. However, judges will only be required rate semifinalist essays in one category, which averages 30-35 essays per level, per judge. The deadline to submit essays for this year's contest is January 6, 2012. Judges will receive their semifinalist essays and judging materials in early February and submit their winners the following month.
