National Reading/Writing Contest Honors 70 Indiana Students

The Indiana Center for the Book, a program of **Letters About Literature** the Indiana State Library, honored 70 Indiana fourth through twelfth graders at the 2012 Letters About Literature Awards Ceremony. The ceremony was held at the

Indiana State Library in Indianapolis. Over 200 guests, including students, teachers and family, attended the ceremony which was headlined by award-winning, young-adult author Margaret McMullan.

This year's ceremony was particularly noteworthy since it featured Indiana's second National Honor winner in the history of the contest. Paw Soe, a sophomore at New Tech Academy at Wayne High School in Fort Wayne, will receive a \$100 GiftCard from Target for taking national honors. Her school's library will also receive a \$1,000 reading promotion grant from Target as a result of her accomplishment. Both of these awards will be presented in a special ceremony at New Tech Academy later this month.

Letters About Literature is a national reading-writing contest that asks students to write a personal letter to an author, explaining how his or her work changed their view of the world or themselves. Letters About Literature is sponsored by the Center for the Book in the Library of Congress, in partnership with Target Stores, and is administered statewide by the Indiana Center for the Book.

Encore of Digital Preservation Workshop Scheduled May 31

Digital Preservation Outreach and Education Program Due to popular demand, the Indiana State Historic Records Advisory Board (SHRAB), in conjunction with the Indiana State Library and Indiana Commission on Public Records, are hosting an encore Digital Preservation Outreach and Education Program (DPOE) workshop on May 31 at

the State Library. The workshop is based on curriculum developed by the Library of Congress' **a**nd is geared towards volunteers and professionals responsible for managing and preserving digital content.

This workshop introduces fundamental concepts for managing your digital content over time through a series of six modules:

- Identify what digital content do you have?
- Select what portion of that content is your responsibility to preserve?
- Store what issues are there for long-term storage?
- Protect what steps need to be taken to protect your digital content?
- Manage what provisions should be made for long-term management?
- Provide what considerations are there for long term access?

This event is free and includes a complimentary lunch courtesy of Indiana SHRAB. Certified public library professionals are eligible to receive six Technology Library Education Units. Update to ADA Law Affects Library Renovations

Updates to the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 (ADA) went into effect on March 15, 2012. The new standards known as the 2010 ADA Standards for Accessible Design focus specifically on creating "wayfinding" signage for the visually impaired. The new ADA standards require a non-glare finish on all signage and recommend a 70 percent contrast between the sign background and lettering. New signage must now include large, bolded characters in both upper- and lowercase and thin, beveled, and widely spaced lettering (for tactile readers).

Libraries remodeled or newly designed after March 15, 2012, must comply with the updated rules. For all other libraries, there are steps that can make existing signage more patronfriendly.
