Entries are now being accepted for the popular "What Indiana Means to Me" Essay Contest for fourth graders statewide. The Indiana Statehouse Tour Office and the Indiana Center for the Book sponsor the annual contest held in conjunction with Indiana Statehood Day - a celebration of Indiana's birthday.

The contest is open to any Indiana public, private or home-schooled fourth-grade student and asks them to convey what living in the state of Indiana and being a Hoosiers means to them. Essays can range from 100 to 400 words, handwritten or typed, and all essays must be postmarked by October 29th, 2012 for consideration. The contest winner and finalists will be asked to read his/her essay at the Statehood Day Celebration on December 11, 2012. assessment and digitization grant opportunities. The archival assessment grant enables institutions to hire a consultant to analyze the conditions of historical records and report recommendations. Digitization grants are available as a means for local entities to digitize specific types of records that may currently be at risk. The digitization of these documents will enable greater access through preservation and online availability.

The SHRAB is providing grant funds of up to \$5,000, which requires a local match in cash or in-kind contributions at least equal to the grant amount. These grants will be available to nonprofit organizations and units of local government in the Indiana. Priority will be given to institutions whose records are currently at risk.

Applications are due to the SHRAB by no later than **Friday, September 14, 2012** and may be found online at SHRAB.IN.gov. Grantees will be announced September 28, 2012.
