The agenda is flexible and open to sessions in a variety of lengths and formats, including traditional conference sessions of approximately 30-35 minutes in length, plus 10 minutes for question and answer; lightning talks of 7-10 minutes; and panel sessions. Those willing to share their experiences in a panel discussion should make note on their submission form. If there are enough submissions, the committee may be able to coordinate a panel.

Topics of interest include, but are not limited to, collaborations and partnerships, controlled digital lending, copyright, customer service, e-books and ILL, e-resources licensing, marketing ILL services, next generation ILL, show and tell, open access, patron-driven services and statistics, particularly effects of COVID on benchmarks.

The conference is open to all Indiana libraries, and the audience may include attendees from academic, public, school and special libraries. Please indicate in the submitted program description whether the presentation targets a specific or general audience.

The U.S. Census Bureau's Age Search Service



In April, the U.S. Census Bureau released previously confidential records from the 1950 census to the delight of genealogists around the world. By federal law, the records that hold any identifying information are kept for 72 years and only released every 10 years after the decennial census. However, there is a way to gain access to census records that remain confidential.

The Census Bureau provides its [Age Search Service](#) to the public for census years 1910 through 2010. There is a \$65 fee and an additional fee of \$10 to search for more information. Researchers can get access to the forms required to use the service [here](#), as well as instructions on who can apply. Use [this tutorial](#) to learn more about the process.

"What's Up Wednesday: NetGalley for Libraries: Live Demo and Overview" webinar scheduled



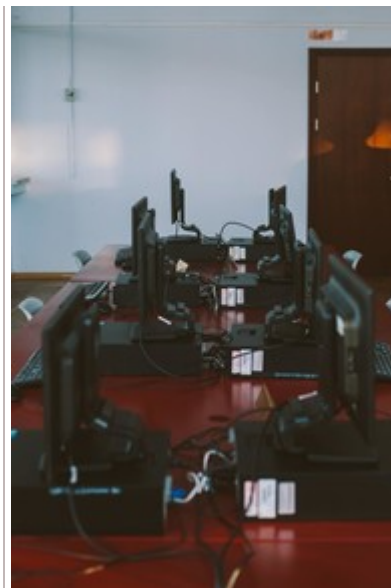

NetGalley is a free website for librarians to request and download digital review copies and audiobooks, while connecting with publishers and staying up to date with upcoming releases. The service is quick, efficient, secure and always free for library staff. Learn how to get started (e.g., registration, filling in a profile and requesting a first book or audiobook), helpful features, tools and ways NetGalley can specifically help librarians with collection development and readers' advisory.

Presenters will be Tarah Theoret, senior director of community experience at NetGalley, and Hallie Fields, social media assistant manager at NetGalley.

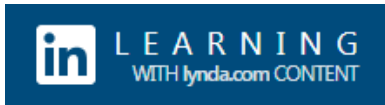

Presentation proposals are now being accepted for the conference. Presentations are being sought in relation to the use of any of the SirsiDynix product lines, such as BLUEcloud Cataloging, MobileCirc, Symphony or Horizon. The INSIRSI officers encourage proposals associated with any aspect of using these products, including those related to public services, library instruction, technical services and systems.

Presentations should last approximately 45 minutes. Chosen presenters must agree to provide INSIRSI copies of their presentations for posting on their respective websites. Questions may be directed to the INSIRSI officers. The deadline to submit a proposal is June 20 and notification regarding acceptance of proposals will take place by July 8.
