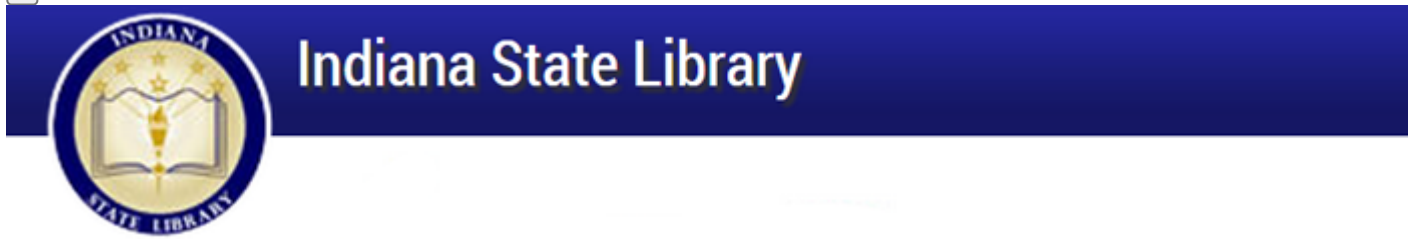

Indiana State Library seeking resource sharing coordinator



The Indiana State Library is currently seeking a resource sharing coordinator. The resource sharing coordinator serves as a central contact for the state's various resource sharing and statewide services, including the InfoExpress courier service, Statewide Remote Circulation Service, Indiana Share and the INSPIRE statewide databases. The resource sharing coordinator facilitates the use of these services through two primary responsibilities: providing customer service to current and potential customers utilizing the State Library's resource-sharing products, and by providing administrative support for the library's resource-sharing products, including statistics and billing.

The consultant also creates and provides training, publications and workshops for library staff on the above projects. The consultant will work closely with other public library and regional consultants, as well as the Management

Candidates must meet the following requirements to be considered for employment: Master of Library Science and a broad knowledge of the Indiana State Library and other libraries; obtain certification by the Indiana State Library and Historical Board as an LC3 within six months of hire; minimum of one year of full-time experience as a librarian; expertise with integrated library systems, such as Evergreen Indiana and other library management software programs; specialized knowledge and awareness of Indiana State Library Collection Development Policy; ability to analyze, evaluate and prioritize materials for digitization based on accuracy, usability and budget authority, scope, treatment, arrangement, format and usability; mastery of applicable federal and state standards for specialized library services and cooperative programs; broad knowledge of specialized conservation and preservation techniques and how to apply them; specialized knowledge in subject areas and information retrieval, especially electronic mediums; and the ability to remain current in technological advances and library sciences.

Census Bureau website redesigned



A key source for gathering information about the surveys that the U.S. Census Bureau conducts and the data it produces, www.Census.gov, has been redesigned for better user interaction.

The new navigation design focuses on the bureau's audience, including partners, researchers, educators and survey respondents. It also focuses on data product and type of information, such as maps, surveys and programs. Those who haven't visited in a while can click [here](#) to explore the new website.

The Indiana State Library often receives questions about the Census Bureau contacting someone by phone or mail about being a participant in a survey. They ask whether the contact they received is legitimate or not. At the top, under the link to [survey respondents](#), or within one quick scroll down the main page, users can find the Census.gov section entitled "Need help with a survey?" with a link to [get survey help](#). This lands at a webpage focusing on help for survey participants, including explanations on how the Census Bureau conducts its surveys and protects participant information. There is also a full webpage enabling users to [verify a Census Bureau survey, mailing or contact](#).

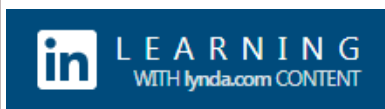
