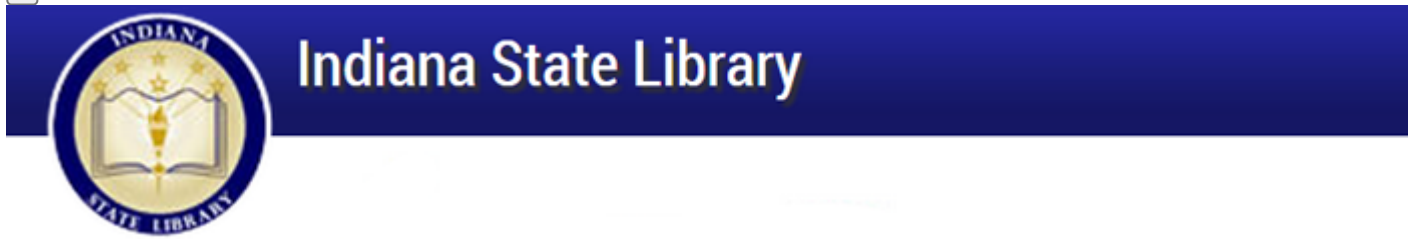

On March 18, The Indiana Library and Historical Board adopted new certification rules for Indiana librarians that will go into effect on Jan. 1, 2023. To help ease the transition, both the Certification Manual and the Detailed Summary of Certification Requirements have been updated to highlight text indicating the changes that will take place under the new rules.

## Indiana State Literacy Association 58th annual conference to be held this weekend

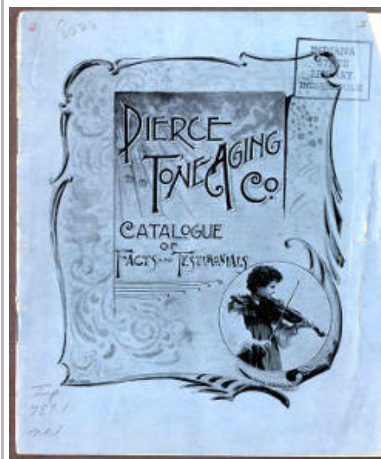

## Pierce Tone Aging Company



This [ornate trade catalog](#) in the Indiana State Library Digital Collection is from the Pierce Tone Aging Company. The name of the company does not adequately describe the interesting nature of the product and the entrepreneur, Burt Pierce.

Pierce was an engraver by trade and a virtuoso violinist who was concertmaster of the Indianapolis Symphony at one time. He patented a secret method to "age" violins, violas and other stringed instruments. This method was designed to speed up the aging process from years into weeks or months.

Pierce's theory was that years of playing a stringed instrument for hours a day were what caused a violin to sound its best. The pamphlet states that the Pierce Tone Aging process involved subjecting the instrument to high-frequency vibrations and pressure that simulated years of use.

Instead of buying an instrument that was hundreds of years old for

The Plainfield-Guilford Township Public Library will host two vaccine clinics at the library in October of this year.

PGTPL is proud to offer two vaccine clinics hosted in partnership with the Plainfield Walmart Supercenter Pharmacy. The first session will be on Wednesday, Oct. 12, from 10 a.m.-1 p.m., and the second will be on Monday, Oct. 17 from 2-5 p.m.

the sound of it, such as one made by Stradivari or Guarneri, one could instead buy a newly minted Pierce violin that would sound equally good but at a much more affordable price. In addition, they could send their current or damaged instrument to Pierce, who would apply his aging process to improve the sound quality.

Pierce only made about 200 violins before a fire damaged his factory. He soon became interested in car engines and joined the automotive industry, which was booming around the turn of the 20th century.

Pierce died in 1956 after having a long career in the auto industry.

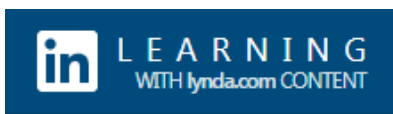

program. Participants under 18 years of age will need a parent or legal guardian. Regular and high dose - for those over 65 - flu vaccines will be available, as well as the new bivalent Pfizer COVID-19 booster vaccine while supplies last.

Participants will need to bring their ID and insurance cards (e.g., medical or pharmacy insurance cards). Billing for the vaccine is sent through insurance and most insurance companies will cover the cost of the vaccine at no charge. Neither cash nor credit will be accepted.
