Historic Main Street home to house Franklin County library's Local History and Genealogy Department



The Franklin County Public Library District recently purchased the home of John Newman, located at 912 Main Street in Brookville.

The historic, two-story brick building will eventually house the library's Local History and Genealogy Department, as the need for additional space has become more prevalent.

"Under Julie Schlesselman's leadership, our Local History and Genealogy Department has grown both in reputation and in volume," said library director Susan Knight. "Our community has generously donated books, photographs, diaries, family research documents and more, including significantsized collections from Ed Baker and Don Dunaway. Along with the Indiana Album, the Indiana State Library and the Allen County Public Library, we were gifted with a select portion of Mr. Newman's papers, books and ephemera. Mr. Newman's collection alone filled Brookville's upper study room. It is a collection that will take months to years to catalog."

The home was purchased at auction on May 2 for \$290,000. Libraries are unique government entities that can save revenue for future use. The Franklin County Public Library District, under the diligent care of the library board, has been saving funds to be put toward future growth. The Newman House was purchased with those saved funds, and there will be no tax increase.

The spacious building will provide needed storage space as well as offer an inviting workspace for library patrons who travel near and far for historical research. Other display and programming ideas are currently being evaluated.

Road map of Marion County showing bicycle routes



What better way to celebrate Bike Week and Bike to Work Day than looking at a bicycle map? This 1900 map, prepared under the supervision of Marion County Commissioner John McGregor shows bicycle routes throughout the county. This map wonderfully shows the towns that sprinkled the county before sprawl and city-county consolidation. Distances are kindly given in a circle out from the center of Indianapolis - seven miles to Millersville, Southport and Broad Ripple.

The Monon was still carrying trains on its rails at this time. The roads were mostly dirt. However, with few cars on the road one can imagine that it was nice to get out into the county on a bicycle, despite the dirt road.

Bicycling saw a boom in popularity in the 1890s. The Indiana State Library has a collection of Indiana bicycle manufacturer catalogs from that same era. A handful of those are digitized and hosted in the Indiana State Library's <u>Trade</u> <u>Catalogs</u> digital collection.

The awards that ILF offers are Outstanding Library Staff Award, ILF Collaboration Award, Outstanding Librarian Award, Outstanding Library Award and Library Champion Award. ILF encourages the nomination of a person, library or organization deserving of recognition due to their outstanding commitment to library excellence.

To be eligible, nominees - except where noted - must be members of the Indiana Library Federation for the year in which they are nominated. Nominators are solely responsible to ensure that all paperwork and letters of recommendation are turned in before the deadline.

In addition to offering awards, the Indiana Library Federation also offers scholarship opportunities. The scholarships include the Esther Schlundt Memorial Scholarship Fund, the Sue Marsh Weller Memorial Scholarship Fund, the William Gresh Memorial Scholarship Scholarship and the David Dickey Continuing Education Award.

The Esther Schlundt Memorial Scholarship Fund is typically awarded to students pursuing a graduate degree, a Library Assistant Associate degree or public library certification courses.

The Sue Marsh Weller Memorial Scholarship Fund provides funding for at least one scholarship for applicants entering or currently enrolled in an ALA-accredited program of graduate study specializing in children's librarianship with plans to work with children or youth.

The William Gresh Memorial Scholarship provides funding for at least one scholarship applicant entering or currently enrolled in a program to receive educational certification in the field of Library Media Services.
