
## **OVERVIEW**

## HIGH-LEVEL PRIORITIES

- 1. Increase the number of postsecondary credentials (general education core and CTE) awarded to high school students
- 2. Increase FAFSA filing statewide
- 3. Increase the number of credentials awarded by public 2-year and 4-year institutions
- 4. Increase the number of adult workers pursuing and earning a postsecondary credential through targeted outreach
- 5. Ensure equitable and quality offerings for online teaching and instruction

## STRATEGIC PLAN ALIGNMENT







- Increase the number of postsecondary credentials awarded in high school
- Expand pipeline of dual credit teachers
- Increase FAFSA completion in high school through partnerships (banks, INvestEd)
- Offer targeted support through intrusive advising practices
- Ensure transferability\* between institutions and K-12 to postsecondary





## STRATEGIC PLAN ALIGNMENT







- Reduce equity gaps in enrollment and completion [by scaling the Scholar Success Program for all students]
- Provide customized services for at-risk students identified through predictive analytics
- ▶ Define "credential of value," create an inventory, adjust attainment calculation
- Identify credentials that facilitate the rapid recovery to the economy
- Investigate and address disparities in technology, internet access and learning-conducive home environments

- Policy Committee of the Governor's Workforce Cabinet review (November)
