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COLLEGE READY BENCHMARK REQUIREMENT

- ▶ Per IC 20-32-5.1-7(e), for each school year beginning after June 30, 2021, a nationally recognized college entrance exam must be administered as Indiana's accountability assessment.
- Code further requires the Commission for Higher Education, in consultation with the state educational institutions, to approve a proficiency benchmark no lower than the national college ready benchmark established for that particular exam.
- The Indiana Department of Education selected the SAT as the nationally recognized college entrance exam.



WHAT DOES THIS IMPACT?

- The proficiency benchmarks approved by the Commission impact:
 - Proficiency reporting by the Indiana Department of Education to the Indiana State Board of Education;
 - Federal Reporting;
 - Indiana Graduates Prepared to Success (GPS) Dashboard; and
 - Indiana's Graduation Pathways (potentially).



WHAT ARE THE GRADUATION PATHWAYS?

- Beginning with the graduating class of 2023, Indiana high school students must satisfy all three of the following Graduation Requirements:
 - Earn credits necessary for a high school diploma;
 - Learn and demonstrate employability skills; AND
 - Demonstrate postsecondary-ready competencies.



EARN CREDITS NECESSARY FOR A HIGH SCHOOL DIPLOMA

There are four diploma designations:

- Core 40 Minimum 40 credits
- Academic Honors Minimum 47 credits
- Technical Honors Minimum 47 credits
- General Minimum 40 credits (Core 40 opt-out conference required)



LEARN AND DEMONSTRATE EMPLOYABILITY SKILLS

- Project-Based Learning: Allows students to gain knowledge and skills by working for an extended period of time to investigate and respond to an authentic, engaging, and complex question.
- ▶ Service-Based Learning: Integrates academic study with service experience, reflects larger social, economic, and societal issues, and collaborative efforts between students, schools, and community partners.
- ► Work-Based Learning: Activities that occur in a workplace while developing the student's skills, knowledge, and readiness for work.

SAT COLLEGE READY BENCHMARKS

Per the College Board:

- Students are considered college and career ready when their SAT section scores meet both the Math and the Evidence-Based Reading and Writing benchmarks
- Students with an SAT Math section score that meets or exceeds the benchmark have a 75% chance of earning at least a C in first-semester, credit-bearing college courses in algebra, statistics, precalculus, or calculus.
- ▶ Students with an SAT Evidence-Based Reading and Writing (ERW) section score that meets or exceeds the benchmark have a 75% chance of earning at least a C in first-semester, credit-bearing college courses in history, literature, social sciences, or writing classes.
