INvestEd's History:

- In 1980, established by the State of Indiana as a non-profit, public benefit corporation—501(c)(3)
- In 2013, INvestEd's statutory nonprofit duties were codified to:
 - Continue providing free "financial aid literacy and educational tools to students, their families, and Indiana colleges and universities with respect to responsibly financing the costs of higher education"
 - The corporation may "make direct loans to or for the benefit of an education loan borrower or to consolidate all or part of the borrower's outstanding education loans into one (1) loan;"
- In 2016, rebranded from ISM to INvestEd
- In 2021, INvestEd partners both statewide & locally with...
 - Commission for Higher Education & Governor's Workforce Cabinet
 - State Colleges/Universities & Independent Colleges/Universities
 - Indiana Student Financial Aid Association, School Counselors, nonprofits, etc.



INvestEd's Mission & Unique Role:

- Increase the educational attainment of Indiana, such as contributing to the Governor's 'Strategic Workforce Plan' and reaching the 2025 Goal:
 - That 60% of all working-age Hoosiers have a postsecondary credential or degree by 2025
- Raise awareness and improve understanding of financial aid and postsecondary planning to make higher education and training more accessible and affordable:
 - Provide all Hoosiers free financial aid literacy outreach, guidance, and resources to responsibly fund education with less (or no) debt
 - Complement local/regional entities (schools, nonprofits, businesses, etc.) with free expert assistance and resources

Outreach & Literacy Events

Starting point

- What has the host asked us to do?
- Who is the audience?
- What are we trying to accomplish?
- Reinforce with families:
 - We will help anytime, anywhere and options to contact us
 - Next steps and resources

Points of emphasis:

- How can we help students continue their education after high school
- Let them know there is a FREE expert resource to help them throughout the process

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Planning



Early Awareness Event – Scope

- Get families informed & energized about planning ahead no matter where they are in the process
 - Junior high or early high school aged students (Ideally)

Goals for event

- Find the right fit (career, program, college, etc.) & how this impacts completion, costs, debt, etc.
- Maximize FREE money
- Minimize student loan debt
- Make clear INvestEd is always available to help

Planning



Early Awareness Event - Topics

- Importance of continuing education after high school
- Benefits of career interest inventory
 - Identify skills and match with potential careers
- Know educational requirements & potential income for career
- ► Find the right college or program that fits
 - Academically
 - Socially
 - Financially

Early Awareness Event - Topics (cont'd)

- Overview of financial aid options
 - FREE money (grants & scholarships)
 - Self-help money (student employment & loans)
- Saving for college (i.e. 529 plans)
- Reducing college costs & time (i.e. AP & dual credit)
- Quick overview of FAFSA
- Benefit of Net Price Calculators
 - Project costs & possible financial aid
- Social media interaction impacts:
 - College/program admission decisions
 - Scholarship decisions





Financial Aid Night - Scope

- Geared toward high school seniors to establish a detailed plan to pay for college
 - Seeing increased number of families of juniors or younger
- Discuss deadlines and important steps for a solid college funding plan
- Demystify the FAFSA process & documents needed
- Highlight financial aid timeline and details of offer letters
- Goals for event
 - Understand financial aid lingo & steps in the process
 - Importance of meeting deadlines
 - Emphasize benefit of applying early to maximize FREE money
 - Make clear INvestEd is always available to help





Financial Aid Night - Topics

- Define financial aid & clarify it is typically a balance of gift & self-help options
- Review financial aid programs
 - Identify grant programs & importance of completing credits each year
 - Reinforce importance of applying for scholarships & provide tips
 - Explain benefits of student employment
 - Provide overview of student loan options
- Highlight key terms & why they are important
 - FAFSA FREE form so don't pay for it
 - EFC Expected Family Contribution (Student Aid Index)
 - Difference of sticker price vs net price

Paying



Financial Aid Night - Topics (cont'd)

- How to create an FSA ID (username & password)
- Cover key sections of the FAFSA to help families avoid common errors that delay processing
 - Clarify when students are dependent vs. independent
 - Identify who should be listed as a parent on the form
 - Importance of the IRS data retrieval process for tax information
 - Outline what assets must be included
- Explain next steps & what to expect
 - Cover FAFSA confirmation page & calculated EFC
 - How to address special circumstances that arise
 - Walk through a sample financial aid offer

Paying



FAFSA Completion Event - Scope

- School or organization brings us in as experts to help students with their financial aid application
- We work with families in a computer lab throughout a specified time frame
- Goals of event
 - Student completes their FAFSA with better accuracy & confidence
 - If unable to complete, student knows what is needed to finish & next steps
 - Everyone in attendance knows our contact information & that we're always available to help

Finalizing



FAFSA Follow Up Event - Scope

- Help Hoosier students finalize their plan to pay for college
- Provide tools to help families compare financial aid offers for more informed decisions
- Understand student loan options & impact of borrowing
- Goals of event
 - Family knows steps to take after filing their FAFSA
 - Clear understanding of what free money has been offered versus employment & loans
 - Student can compare financial aid offers & identify the bottom line
 - Entire cost of education for the program is considered not simply 1 year

Finalizing



FAFSA Follow Up Event - Topics (cont'd)

- Utilize tools to help family compare financial aid offers side-byside
 - Clearly identify grants & scholarships
 - Determine if student employment is offered
 - Know details of student and/or parent loans listed
- Emphasize impact of amount borrowed not just for first year, but for full program
- Be clear on next steps in the process
 - Take action on what is needed to secure the money offered
 - Know which items are renewable & what is that criteria
 - Secure spot for housing, registration, orientation, etc.

Events Synopsis

In A Perfect World:

- Families would be invested in the process:
 - Start early & save for college (529 plans, etc.)
 - Complete every step in the early awareness presentation & follow our checklists
 - Not miss deadlines
 - Graduate on-time or complete a certificate program with minimal student loan debt







Survey Data



INvestEd Statewide Survey

- > 88% of Hoosiers surveyed value education beyond high school
- ► 76% of those surveyed are concerned about student loan debt levels
- 89% of survey respondents want access to FREE & transparent financial aid literacy resources
