EXECUTIVE BIOGRAPHY



T. Neil Moore was appointed to the position of executive director of the Indiana Criminal Justice Institute (ICJI) on February 29, 2008. Neil started with the agency on March 17, 2008.

In this role, he is responsible for leading statewide public policy and for the planning and administration of more than \$30 million in federal and state funds deigned to improve Indiana's criminal and juvenile justice systems.

Prior to joining ICJI, Neil served as the director for the Center of Criminal Science at the Indiana Institute of Technology in Fort Wayne, Indiana where he has resided for more than 30 years.

Neil has an extensive background in criminal justice, professionally and academically. He began his law enforcement career in 1977 with the Fort Wayne Police Department five years after graduating with a B.A. in Criminal Justice Studies from Kent State University. After 11 years of working as a Fort Wayne police officer, he was promoted to serve as the city's chief of police in 1988. Neil held this position for 10 years before retiring in 1997.

In 1997, with 22 years of law enforcement experience, Neil became an assistant professor at the School of Public and Environmental Affairs at Indiana University-Purdue University Fort Wayne. During his academic career, he assisted police and sheriffs' departments in establishing community policing initiatives and improving communications between officers and citizens.

Neil holds a Masters of Public Administration (MPA) from Indiana University and a Doctor of Education (Ed.D.) from Ball State University.
