CTAP is Indiana's small business assistance program, and is a non-regulatory program that provides free, confidential compliance and technical assistance to regulated entities.

According to a United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) fact sheet on storm water, "When it rains or snows, the water that runs off of city streets, parking lots, and construction sites can wash sediment, oil, grease, toxics, pathogens, and other pollutants into nearby storm drains. Once this pollution has entered the sewer system, it is discharged-(usually) untreated-into local streams and waterways. Known as storm water runoff, this pollution is a leading threat to public health and the environment today."

The Indiana Department of Environmental Management administers a general permit program that targets storm water runoff. The industrial storm water rule applies to marinas with certain activities which are exposed to storm water and have a point source discharge of storm water from those activities. Facility managers are required to submit a Notice of Intent and implement a storm water pollution prevention plan to address the discharge of pollutants associated with storm water runoff from their facility.

This presentation will provide information on how the storm water rule affects marinas, how it should be implemented and what compliance measures should be taken.
