Currently, fewer than 60 Hoosier workplaces have achieved certification in VPP.

“Participation in VPP is reserved for only those work sites that truly are exemplary in their efforts to reduce and eliminate worker injuries, illnesses and fatalities,” said Indiana Department of Labor Commissioner Lori Torres. “The Indiana Department of Labor is proud to work with our newest partner, RR Donnelley, to advance the safety and health of our most valuable asset — the Hoosier worker.”
