COVID-19 Update on Data and Key Activities Age Among Unique COVID+ Cases






COVID-19 Update on Data and Key Activities Positive Cases by County & Funding Type


The Intersection of Waiver Program and Behavior


Data used: Indiana's 2018-2019 National Core Indicators (NCI) In-Person Survey. This survey allows Indiana to assess the outcomes of services provided to people access services and supports via the Bureau of Developmental Disabilities Services.

Sampling procedures: The sample surveyed was stratefied by waiver and then randomly selected.


Sample: Total 742 of waiver recipients 18 years or older, made up of Community Integration and Habilitation (CIH) waiver = 370; Family Support waiver (FSW) = 372.








. Do those that self-injure have a behavior plan?


Fishbone Diagram

- A visual way to look at cause and effect
- Sort ideas into useful categories
- Structured approach to brainstorm causes of a problem
- Problem is displayed at the head of the fish
- Categories are identified
- Contributing causes are listed on the smaller 'bones' under the categories

Background: Community Connections for People with Disabilities

- Offered through the Indiana Office of Community and Rural Affairs (OCRA) in partnership with the Indiana Division of Disability and Rehabilitative Services (DDRS).
- Funded with Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) grant funds available through CARES Act
- \$4.9 million total; \$200,000 maximum award cap
- Targeted at Hoosiers with disabilities aged 18+
- Open to all counties, cities and towns statewide
- Intended to support activities that can be completed in 6 9 months
- Intended for public services activities only. Goals targeted at activities that address:
 - internet access and technology equity
 - social isolation and lost access to natural supports
- Application open Friday, October 23rd; Informational Webinar on Monday, October 26th



CCPWD Grant: Next Steps for Stakeholders

- 1. To qualify for a grant, applicants must partner with a Developmental Disabilities organization that is local, non-profit, and BDDS-enrolled
 - If you're a qualifying DD organization, talk with your local city, town, or county officials about partnering on the grant
 - If you're a stakeholder/advocate, share the grant opportunity with your community leaders; connect them with an interested DD organization
- 2. Every applicant must conduct a public hearing and receive public comment on the grant proposal
 - Participate in the public hearing and provide public comment; applicants must make special effort to seek public comment from adults with disabilities

BDDS Gateway: Overview

BDDS Gateway


- Online virtual mechanism for individuals and families to apply for BDDS services
- Questions and/or suggestions can be submitted to BDDS.SCPHelp@fssa.IN.gov
- Training targeted for January 2021
- Targeted for release during the 1st quarter of 2021

Benefits

- Allows families and individuals to apply for BDDS services from any location at any time of day (virtual flexibility expected in today's world)
- Increases systematic traceability and historical data tracking for the entire BDDS application process
- Reduces data errors and inefficiency of BDDS Staff needing to transcribe application information from a hand-written form

BDDS Portal 2.0 Overview

BDDS Portal 2.0


- Enhancements to BDDS Gateway (including NBAR/CIH submission capability and credentialing for Individuals/Families through Access IN established)
- BDDS Portal will undergo substantial enhancement so that antiquated INsite system can be retired
- BDDS.SCPHelp@fssa.IN.gov still in place
- Targeted for release in Fall 2021

Benefits

- Additional virtual features for Individuals/Families to take advantage, especially as it relates to starting, saving and coming back to an NBAR/CIH application
- Providers will have the ability to manage and retain their own provider data within the BDDS Portal. (i.e. telephone number, email address, etc.)
- Improved ability to take care of the individuals BDDS serves with increased data transparency between Providers, CMCOs, and BDDS staff.
- Reduction of one legacy system and inclusion of some data and processes that are currently tracked outside of any system



BDDS IT Systems – Future State





Future BDDS IT Systems Considerations

- Allow provider enrollment virtually through the BDDS Gateway
- Allow Families/Individuals with BDDS Gateway credentials to update/maintain their personal information
- Consolidation of DART into the BDDS Portal
- Consolidation of additional ancillary systems and processes into the BDDS Portal
- Additional enhancements to improve data transparency between Providers, CMCOs, and BDDS Staff
