<u> AMHH & MRO Service Comparisons</u>

This guide provides a comparison of the service unit allowances for the initial packages for Adult Mental Health Habilitation (AMHH) and Medicaid Rehabilitative Option (MRO). It is meant to serve as a supportive companion as you develop the most appropriate, person-centered care plan for your client. Both programs offer a Prior Authorization option that allows additional units to be requested, if necessary for the care of the client.

> NOTE: Initial unit allowances for AMHH services are equivalent across all qualifying ANSA scores; for MRO services, unit allowances that differ depending on ANSA/LON will be specifically denoted.

AMHH Service Maximums

This guide provides a simple overview of the services a member of the AMHH program has access to upon assignment of a package. Keep in mind that the service limits described in this guide denotes only the initial package - if a member reaches their unit maximums, agencies are able to submit Prior Authorizations (PA) through DARMHA to request additional service units for the eligibility period.

Adult Day Services

What Is It?

A community-based, non-residential program designed to provide health, wellness, social, and therapeutic activities in a structured, supportive environment to help member meet their needs and goals identified in the IICP.

What's the Unit Maximum?

A maximum of two half-day units per day is allowed up to five days per week.

What's a Unit?

Adult Day Units are measured in "half-days." A single "half-day" unit is defined as a minimum of three hours to a maximum of five hours per day. Two units are defined as more than five hours with a maximum of eight hours per day.

What Are the Modifiers?

N/A

Supported Community Engagement

What Is It?

Services that engage the member in meaningful community involvement in activities such as volunteerism or community service. Services are aimed at the general result of community engagement.

What's the Unit Maximum?

A maximum of 18 hours per month - a total of 72 units - is afforded in the initial package

What's a Unit?

A unit of Supported Community Engagement is defined in 15-minute increments

What Are the Modifiers?

N/A



Care Coordination

What Is It?

Care coordination consists of services that help recipients gain access to needed medical, social, educational, and other services. This includes direct assistance in gaining access to services, coordination of care, oversight of the entire case, and linkage to appropriate services.

What's a Unit?

A unit of Care Coordination is defined in 15-minute increments

What's the Unit Maximum?

A maximum of 400 hours per year - a total of 1,600 units - is afforded in the initial package

What Are the Modifiers?

Respite Care

What Is It?

Short-term services provided to recipients who are (1) unable to care for themselves and (2) living with a non-professional, unpaid caregiver in the absence of the non-professional caregiver.

What's a Unit?

A unit of Respite Care can be defined either in 15-minute increments or per diem (Eight to 24 hours)

What's the Unit Maximum?

15-minute Unit	Up to seven hours per day (28 units) for a maximum of 75 hours per year (300 units)
Per Diem	Up to 14 consecutive days for a maximum of 28 days per year

What Are the Modifiers?

HCB Habilitation and Support

What Is It?

Face-to-face services directed at the health, safety and welfare of the member and assisting in the management, adaptation and/or retention of skills necessary to support member's ability to live successfully in the most integrated setting appropriate to the member's needs.

What's a Unit?

A unit of HCB Habilitation and Support is defined in 15-minute increments

What's the Unit Maximum?

A maximum of six hours per day (24 units)

Therapy and Behavioral Support

What Is It?

A series of time-limited, structured, face-to-face sessions delivered in non-clinic settings that work toward the goals identified in the IICP of the AMHH member.

A maximum of 75 hours per year (300 units) for individual and group

Addiction Counseling

What Is It?

Planned, organized, face-to-face service with addiction professionals and other clinicians to provide counseling intervention to the AMHH member or significant other(s), to works toward the recipient's recovery goals identified in the IICP.

A unit of Addiction Counseling is defined in one hour increments

What's the Unit Maximum?

A maximum of 75 hours per year (75 units) for services delivered to the AMHH Member in an Individual Setting

There is a maximum of 32 hours (32 units) for all other subtypes

What Is It?
