

Equity Action Plan for Paths to QUALITY™

As a result of a review of the accessibility and effectiveness of Indiana's Quality Rating and Improvement System, Paths to QUALITY™, the Indiana Family and Social Services Administration's Office of Healthy Opportunities recommended the following high impact, low effort activities to propel the program's equity priority:

- ✓ Policy and process statements that address nondiscrimination, disability inclusion and accommodations.
- ✓ Language access for state forms, trainings, rating visits and program materials.
- ✓ Cultural humility and responsiveness training for coaches and technical assistance staff.
- ✓ Resource referrals to address basic and social needs that families may have.

The Office of Early Childhood and Out-of-School Learning (OECOSL) is committed to initiating the following activities and efforts in response to these recommendations:
