Borden, Indiana is a small town approximately 30 minutes north of Louisville with a population of 786, and until now the Borden Police had routinely sourced Narcan from the volunteer fire station just down the street. However, on this particular Tuesday no one was available to access the fire station's Narcan.



Two doses of Naloxone were run by foot across the train tracks and street by the school's assistant principal Toby Cheatham. Once on scene Cheatham administered the first dose to the young woman, but no improvement was observed in her condition so the second dose was given to the young woman and within 30 seconds she began to
