
## Little Magnets = Big Problem

Rare-earth, high-powered magnets are not your typical refrigerator magnet. Measuring only 5 millimeters (0.20 inches) in diameter, these powerful magnets are candy-sized and easily swallowed. Appoximately 80% of all high-powered magnet ingestions result in endoscopic or surgical intervention.<sup>2</sup>

## **Tips for Caregivers**




- Rare-earth, high-powered magnets are not toys.
- These magnets should not be kept in homes, schools, or other settings where there are children.





## **Tips for Medical Professionals**

If two or more magnets are swallowed, the magnetic force can make holes in the intestines. Do not wait for magnets to pass.
