State announces more than \$76 million in new funding for crisis response and substance use disorder services

The Indiana Family and Social Services Administration's Division of Mental Health and Addiction (DMHA) is providing new funding to help build and support projects across Indiana to improve mental health and recovery services for Hoosiers. This includes funding from the federal American Rescue Plan Act and the National Opioid Settlement, and totals more than \$76 million.

As part of the National Opioid Settlement, DMHA, in partnership with the Office of Governor Eric J. Holcomb, is awarding a total of \$19 million in one-time funding to support evidence-based prevention, treatment, recovery and harm reduction services, expand the behavioral health workforce and implement other services and initiatives across the state, to 30 local units of government, service providers, and community organizations.

Innovation for Opioid Overdose Reversal

The U.S, Food and Drug Administration (FDA) has approved OPVEE (nalmefene) nasal spray, a new medication, for the reversal of overdose by natural or synthetic opioids in those 12 and older. OPVEE contains nalmefene, an opioid receptor antagonist that provides fast onset and long duration reversal of opioid-induced respiratory depression, which is the primary cause of opioid overdose injury and death.

"OPVEE's FDA approval represents a significant achievement in the development of new treatment

options to address today's era of opioid overdoses that are driven by powerful synthetic opioids, such as fentanyl," said Mark Crossley, CEO, Indivior.

OPVEE is expected to be in the market in Q4 of 2023. CLICK THIS LINK

Three or more concussions linked with worse brain function later in life

Research indicates that people who have experienced three or more even mild episodes of concussion should be counselled on whether to continue high-risk activities.

The team found that participants who reported three episodes of even mild concussion throughout their lives had significantly worse attention and ability to complete complex tasks. Those who had four or more mild concussion episodes also showed worsened processing speed and working memory. Each additional reported concussion was linked to progressively worse cognitive function.

Grain-Related Entrapments increased 45% from 2021 to 2022

In May 2023, Purdue University released the 2022 Summary of U.S. Agricultural Confined Space-Related Injuries and Fatalities. Overall, there were 83 agricultural confined space-related cases, which include grain entrapments, equipment entanglements, and grain handling facility fires or explosions. Indiana reported the second highest number of agricultural confined space-related cases after Iowa.

In 2022, there were 42 grain-related entrapments, which is the greatest number of grain entrapments in over a decade. The majority of grain entrapment cases occurred in the Midwest, and four cases were documented in Indiana.
