Cemetery Heritage Initiative, Historical Marker Program, IHB

Indiana Code 4-23-7.2-11 mandates the Historical Marker Program; the Indiana Library and Historical Board on March 30, 2001 authorized this initiative as part of the program. This Cemetery Heritage initiative has three purposes: to reinforce the importance of cemeteries as a resource for the interpretation of Indiana's history; to bring attention to the existence of Indiana's remaining cemeteries with a visual reminder of their importance; to assist the many individuals and groups working to preserve and maintain Indiana's cemeteries through a heightened awareness of their existence and needs.

Cemetery and Burial Grounds Registry, DHPA, DNR

Both historic cemeteries and prehistoric burial areas are located in our state. Cemeteries are part of our cultural landscape in which more and more citizens are becoming interested. Indiana Code 14-21-1-13.5 directs the Indiana Department of Natural Resources, Division of Historic Preservation and Archaeology (DHPA) to create a registry of all cemeteries and burial grounds in each county in Indiana. Knowing the location of as many cemeteries as possible in the state will help provide better protection of these resources. The registry will include coordination with agencies, organizations, and individuals. This project will help insure that future Hoosiers will have a wealth of information to draw upon regarding the resting places of those who have gone before us.

Eligibility Requirements to Obtain Cemetery Heritage Signs

- A cemetery must be listed in the DHPA Cemetery and Burial Grounds Registry, established by Indiana Code 14-21-1-13.5. Contact DHPA to determine if a cemetery is listed.
- A cemetery must be at least fifty years old.
- Prehistoric burial areas will not be marked unless they are adequately protected.

Guidelines for Obtaining Cemetery Heritage Signs

1. The two-page Application must be completed (do not send money) and sent to the

2. Applicant may be awarded more than one sign for the same site.
3. All sign(s) must be pre-paid **when invoiced** by the Indiana Historical Bureau.
4. Applicant must pay the full cost of the sign(s), plus shipping, handling, and tax.



Sign Specifications

- All signs are 24" x 24" .080 gauge aluminum with Scotch Lite 3M UV coating. There are 4 holes for installation on posts or other surfaces. The 4 corners are rounded.
- Background color is dark blue; art and lettering are yellow. The sign is designed to suggest the traditional Indiana state marker format.
- Signs are custom printed with the name, date of establishment of cemetery, and credit line. Text is on one side only.
- Cost is \$129; shipping, handling, and tax will be added as appropriate.
