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CHAIRMAN RAMOS: I call to order the meeting of the Indiana Civil Rights Commission public meeting of December 20th, 2019. It is 1:10 in the afternoon. My apologies for being a little bit late. Our staff have some doors that they've decorated, and we were given a quick tour. The rest of the Commissioners will want to do that before we leave today.

We have a full agenda in front of us. We have a -- we do have a quorum, so thanks be to everyone for being here, and Happy Holidays. I would like an announcement of the agenda, Ms. Tracy.

MS. RICHARDSON: Yes. We will approve the previous minutes. We will have the ICRC's Director's Report, and actually, the Director is not going to be here today. He has a meeting at the Governor's Office, but this has been submitted to each individual. If you don't have a copy, let us know, please. We are working on getting all of your information to you.

And we will proceed with Old Business, Veronica -- and I apologize if I get this wrong -- Zimchik [sic] versus Northern Indiana Public Services; Rick Cavaness versus Aramack [sic]; Tony Finch versus Aramack; Kimberly Perez versus American Senior Communities, LLC; Kimberly Perez versus American Senior Communities, LLC d/b/a Eagle Care, LLC.

We'll move on to New Business, the Appointment of Commissioners to Complainants' Appeals of Director's Findings, Charles Andrews versus BMV. There is a motion before us, Linda Williams versus Golf View Apartments.

We will then review the Administrative Law Judge Decisions and Orders in the cases of Turner versus Mercedes-Benz; Brownson versus Finzel's Mastertech; ICRC and Kelly versus Lafayette Urban Ministry; Garcia versus Garden Table. From the meeting standpoint, I'm just looking at it quickly to see if there's any questions that anyone might have. I don't see anything that sticks out. Commissioners, do you have any questions or -- any questions that you want to address with Ms. Tracy?

MS. RICHARDSON: Yes. My name is Tracy Richardson, and I'm the new hire. I am the precause investigative attorney for the Indiana Civil Rights Commission. So, I'll be aiding and assisting with the Intake Unit as well as the Investigation Unit on the precause aspect of complaints that are filed before the Commission, to make sure that they are following our statute
and that we are protecting the citizens of Indiana's constitutionally protected right to not be subject to unlawful discrimination.

So, we want to make sure that everything we bring before you is going to be within the four corners of the statute for the Indiana Civil Rights Commission, so we're going to be working together to do that.

CHAIRMAN RAMOS: Okay. Thank you.
Commissioners, any questions on that part?
COMM. SLASH: My only question on the November Agency at a Glance is this -- it says it's a change from July. Is that a typo? Is it a change from October?

MS. RICHARDSON: I did not do the typing, so I'm not -- I'm not aware --

COMM. SLASH: Okay.
MS. RICHARDSON: -- of how that was handled.

COMM. SLASH: Okay. That's my only main question.

CHAIRMAN RAMOS: Any news on a new

CHAIRMAN RAMOS: The motion carries.
We are now in New Business, so in the Appointment of Commissioners to Appeals Courts, Charles Andrews versus BMV. Is there anyone here -- Mr. Andrews? Are you Mr. Andrews?

MR. ANDREWS: Yes.
CHAIRMAN RAMOS: Sir, it is my understanding that you were not able to provide all of the information in a timely manner. Would you like to address that for us?

MR. ANDREWS: I don't know what that means. I've got all of the information with me now, asking for a reinvestigation. So, that's why I'm here. This is a letter I got from ICRC, telling me to be here today -- or asking me to be here. I have a question: What's a quorum?

CHAIRMAN RAMOS: It means we have to have a majority of Commissioners here, which we do have a quorum.

MR. ANDREWS: Okay. You said there's no oral arguments. I don't know what that means. I have to talk in order to ask for a re-evaluation.

CHAIRMAN RAMOS: It is my understanding that they had not received information in a timely manner, but that we have the opportunity, if you have additional information that you would like to submit, we can approve that. The information will go to Ms. Tracy, and Ms. Tracy will distribute it to whatever Commissioner is assigned to that case.

MR. ANDREWS: Okay. Well, what do you mean by "a timely manner"? I have filed my
appeal on time and I'm here on time. What is not in a timely manner?

CHAIRMAN RAMOS: Ms. Tracy will --
MS. RICHARDSON: There's a
statutorily prescribed deadline for filing an appeal. I am not involved in that part of the process, but apparently it was found that you had not submitted your documentation within that statutorily prescribed time.

MR. ANDREWS: Well, that's not true. I came down in person to submit it. I think I had a week or two to go, and they accepted it and told me I was -- had plenty of time. I was before the deadline, so $I$ have no idea what that means.

CHAIRMAN RAMOS: So, Mr. Andrews, as -- from the Commission's standpoint, since there is some level of confusion and you have some additional information, we will allow that you provide that information to --

MR. ANDREWS: Okay.
CHAIRMAN RAMOS: -- Ms. Tracy, and it will be distributed through the Commission.

MR. ANDREWS: All right. And Mr. Diaz Dyer, I think, was supposed to call me back with the name of the investigator that was on this case for the last year and a half. They made me wait a year and a half before I received the finding. I never knew the name of the investigator, or if $I$ did a long time ago, $I$ forgot it, and I haven't heard from him. He's not here today, per chance, is he?

MS. RICHARDSON: Who's your
investigator?
MR. ANDREWS: Pardon?
MS. RICHARDSON: Who is your

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investigator?
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CHAIRMAN RAMOS: I don't think he knows.

MR. ANDREWS: I don't know.
MR. HEALY: He doesn't know.
MR. ANDREWS: He was supposed to come, but I don't know who it was.

MS. RICHARDSON: Who -- is there a

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name on your --
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CHAIRMAN RAMOS: We'll accept that as
to provide you an answer before you leave today, so if you give the information to Ms. Tracy, we'll also get an answer for you on who that investigator is.

MR. ANDREWS: Okay. Who's Ms. Tracy, now? Is that --

MS. RICHARDSON: I'm --
CHAIRMAN RAMOS: This is Ms. Tracy.
MS. RICHARDSON: May I ask: Is that only your complaint that you have with you?

MR. ANDREWS: This is all of the information you need for a re-evaluation. Can I briefly describe what it is --

MS. RICHARDSON: You must --
MR. ANDREWS: -- two or three
minutes?
CHAIRMAN RAMOS: It is more relevant to go --

MR. ANDREWS: Yes.
CHAIRMAN RAMOS: ExCuse me, sir.
Once it has been reviewed by our administrative group, then they make a recommendation to us, and then we review it at that time. So, since it's
new information, we want to follow the process, and that gives it to Ms. Tracy. She'll handle that process and go from there.

MR. ANDREWS: Well, this is the new information, this is the old. Do I give this -when I give this to you, should I say, "Here is the proof for this, here is the proof for that"? Should I make any statements so you'll understand what I'm giving you?

MS. RICHARDSON: No, you can just submit your documentation to the Commission, and the Commission will go through it, and --

MR. ANDREWS: You think they can figure it out?

MS. RICHARDSON: -- and if there are any questions, they can come back --

MR. ANDREWS: Okay.
MS. RICHARDSON: -- and go over it.
CHAIRMAN RAMOS: They're thorough. They're thorough, Mr. --

MR. ANDREWS: All right.
CHAIRMAN RAMOS: -- Andrews.
MR. ANDREWS: I'm a little leery of
that, because I remember being told if they had any questions, they would contact me a year and a half ago, and I never heard from them for a year and a half. They didn't call me to fact check anything, and I would appreciate it if they would call me if they have any questions at all. But I would like to explain what this new information is, but you're saying $I$ cannot do that, $I$ just have to give it to you?

MS. RICHARDSON: You don't have a -MR. ANDREWS: I want to make sure it's clear.

MS. RICHARDSON: -- statutorily protected right to do that. That's in the discretion of the Chair.

MR. ANDREWS: Okay. Well, all right. I'll be giving you this, then. This is all of the new information I have, because when I filed initially in April of 2018, I filed prematurely. I had no idea what was going on at the time, and I didn't know what the BMV was up to and what they were all about. I didn't know -- well, but after April 2018, I discovered what they were all
about and what they were up to.
And so, I have all of the proper
information, the facts, a complete discovery with all of the truth in this stack. So, I'd like for the ICRC to reinvestigate, because the initial investigation was completely false, because the IR -- ICRC received false information from the BMV, and I have the proof of that in here, which I will be giving to you.

CHAIRMAN RAMOS: So, Mr. Andrews, I will personally take that case from an appointment standpoint.

MR. ANDREWS: Okay.
CHAIRMAN RAMOS: So, if you want to provide the information to Ms. Tracy, and then if there are questions in it and we get through it, then we will contact you directly.

MR. ANDREWS: Okay.
CHAIRMAN RAMOS: And you know who is assigned to the case; okay?

MR. ANDREWS: Do you want me to give it to you right now?

MS. RICHARDSON: Sure, yes, you can
do that.
COMM. JACKSON: And you're talking about your originals; right?

MR. ANDREWS: No, those are copies.
You can keep them. You can make copies. I don't care if you return them to me or not. You can keep them. You can dispense them to anybody else in the state if you want to. I do not need them back. They're yours.

COMM. JACKSON: Thank you.
COMM. SLASH: Thank you.
CHAIRMAN RAMOS: Thank you.
MR. ANDREWS: And what I have here is the old information I gave the ICRC in April of 2018, before $I$ knew what was going on, so I gave them some very sketchy material that they couldn't possibly make a proper finding from. I get confused and completely uninformed when I read them myself. That's how little I knew in April of 2018, so this is a copy of everything I gave you people in April of 2018. It should be thrown away, into the wastebasket, because it's totally useless. That is a hundred percent
useful.
CHAIRMAN RAMOS: Okay.
MR. ANDREWS: The only thing that you had that was proper in April of 2018 was a copy of my testing history from the BMV, which showed that I passed every test, no problem, every test the BMV had. So, my suspension is illegal in the first place, and I explain in there why they went ahead and suspended me anyway. But that's all they had, and so, they should have and could have noticed that something was wrong. Why did the BMV suspend me when I did nothing wrong, passed every test, and --

CHAIRMAN RAMOS: Thank you,
Mr. Andrews. I -- we appreciate this.
MR. ANDREWS: Yeah. Okay.
CHAIRMAN RAMOS: This is not an open forum.

MR. ANDREWS: Okay.
CHAIRMAN RAMOS: Please pass the information to Ms. Tracy.

MR. ANDREWS: But they did call and ask me, so that's the only point $I$ was making.

CHAIRMAN RAMOS: Thank you.
MR. ANDREWS: So, I'm going to keep these and throw them away, because you have all of this anyway from April of 2018.

CHAIRMAN RAMOS: Thank you.
MR. ANDREWS: I just wanted to emphasize that -- why it's useless and that the BMV, when they responded in May of 2018 to you people, they completely lied. And I had in there a line-for-line expose of their lies, with the proof and evidence behind it.

CHAIRMAN RAMOS: Thank you.
All right. Let's move to the next item on the agenda. The next item is --

MR. ANDREWS: Am I finished and can leave, or --

CHAIRMAN RAMOS: Yes, you -- I appreciate you giving the information to our -thank you.

MR. ANDREWS: Okay.
CHAIRMAN RAMOS: The next item is the motion Linda Williams versus Golf View Apartments, and if you read through the motion,
they are requesting an approval of an additional 15 days, and both parties are in agreement with that. So, since they are both in approval, I recommend that we have a motion to approve the 15-day extension.

COMM. SLASH: So moved.
CHAIRMAN RAMOS: I need a second.
COMM. BLACKBURN: Second.
CHAIRMAN RAMOS: Any opposition or questions?
(No response.)
CHAIRMAN RAMOS: All those in favor, signify by saying aye.

COMM. JACKSON: Aye.
COMM. HARRINGTON: Aye.
COMM. SLASH: Aye.
COMM. BLACKBURN: Aye.
CHAIRMAN RAMOS: Aye.
Any opposed?
(No response.)
CHAIRMAN RAMOS: The motion carries.
The next items are the reviews for the
Administrative Law Judge Decisions and Orders.

In the case of Turner verses Mercedes-Benz, this is a dismissal that -- on a discrimination suit, and since neither party is -- since neither party has had any objections to dismiss this, I recommend that we approve the motion for the ALJ's dismissal. I need a motion to approve.

COMM. SLASH: So moved.
CHAIRMAN RAMOS: I need a second. COMM. JACKSON: Second.

CHAIRMAN RAMOS: All those in favor, signify by saying aye.

COMM. JACKSON: Aye.
COMM. HARRINGTON: Aye.
COMM. SLASH: Aye.
COMM. BLACKBURN: Aye.
CHAIRMAN RAMOS: Aye.
Any opposed?
(No response.)
CHAIRMAN RAMOS: Motion carries. In
the next case of Brownson versus Finzel's Mastertech, the parties have jointly filed a timely notice of election, and the ALJ has dismissed the complaint and neither party has
objected. I recommend we have a motion to approve.

COMM. SLASH: So moved.
CHAIRMAN RAMOS: I need a second.
COMM. HARRINGTON: Second.
CHAIRMAN RAMOS: Any questions or discussion?
(No response.)
CHAIRMAN RAMOS: All those in favor, signify by saying aye.

COMM. JACKSON: Aye.
COMM. HARRINGTON: Aye.
COMM. SLASH: Aye.
COMM. BLACKBURN: Aye.
CHAIRMAN RAMOS: Aye.
Any opposed?
(No response.)
CHAIRMAN RAMOS: The motion carries. The next case is ICRC (Kelly) versus Lafayette Urban Ministry. In this case, the ALJ is recommending dismissal of the complaint under the Indiana Fair Housing Act because under this complaint, it was -- I'm sorry -- it was filed in
a timely manner to dismiss the complaint against the Indiana Fair Housing Act. The complaint under the Civil Rights prong was not dismissed and remains in the administrative forum. So -COMM. SLASH: Can we have a little clarity about what that means?

MS. RICHARDSON: Well, the Respondent has filed a timely notice of election, so the Respondent is going to State Court, and once that occurs, by statute, then you all will dismiss the complaint before the Commission --

CHAIRMAN RAMOS: Yeah.
MS. RICHARDSON: -- because they're going to State Court.

COMM. SLASH: All right.
CHAIRMAN RAMOS: So, there's one bite at the apple, and this case is going to State Court.

COMM. SLASH: All right. I move that we dismiss this case.

CHAIRMAN RAMOS: I need a second.
COMM. HARRINGTON: Second.
COMM. JACKSON: Second.

CHAIRMAN RAMOS: All those in favor, signify by saying aye.

COMM. JACKSON: Aye.
COMM. HARRINGTON: Aye.
COMM. SLASH: Aye.
COMM. BLACKBURN: Aye.
CHAIRMAN RAMOS: Aye.
Any opposed?
(No response.)
CHAIRMAN RAMOS: The motion carries.
The fourth case is the case of Garcia versus the Garden Table, and the ALJ has granted Respondent's request for default judgment. Is Mr. Garcia here today, or anyone representing Mr. Garcia?
(No response.)
CHAIRMAN RAMOS: Hearing none, then I recommend that we uphold the default judgment as recommended by the ALJ. I need a motion to approve.

COMM. SLASH: So moved.
CHAIRMAN RAMOS: I need a second.
COMM. JACKSON: Second.

CHAIRMAN RAMOS: All those in favor, signify by saying aye.

COMM. JACKSON: Aye.
COMM. HARRINGTON: Aye.
COMM. SLASH: Aye.
COMM. BLACKBURN: Aye.
CHAIRMAN RAMOS: Aye. The motion carries.

Okay. That takes us to the meeting dates. In conversation with the Executive Director's Office, these dates are tentative. The one for sure will be on the 17th of January, but the others, particularly the one in June, when we have the housing event and stuff, that one may fluctuate, so that one's not quite firm.

COMM. HARRINGTON: And July, that usually conflicts with our meeting of the Governors.

CHAIRMAN RAMOS: Yeah.
COMM. SLASH: And Our Board is
directly on that date this year.
CHAIRMAN RAMOS: Yeah. So, it is -don't put it on your calendars yet. We'll review

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them all in January.
    COMM. HARRINGTON: So, June and July?
    CHAIRMAN RAMOS: Yes.
    COMM. HARRINGTON: Thank you.
    COMM. SLASH: Okay.
    CHAIRMAN RAMOS: Any other questions
as far as meeting dates are concerned?
                            (No response.)
                            CHAIRMAN RAMOS: All right. So
the 17th. They're doing some kind of activity on
the 17th as well, as I recall.
    MS. RICHARDSON: I'm not sure.
    COMM. SLASH: Oh, that should be the
placing of the wreath.
    CHAIRMAN RAMOS: It is.
    COMM. SLASH: It's the Friday before.
    CHAIRMAN RAMOS: Yes, it is.
    COMM. HARRINGTON: The 17th?
    COMM. SLASH: Uh-huh.
    COMM. HARRINGTON: You're right.
    COMM. SLASH: Uh-huh.
    CHAIRMAN RAMOS: That, and then is
    there -- is that the service day as well?
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COMM. SLASH: Yes, but that generally falls the first half of the day. Do you all know, office-wise, what you're doing yet?

MS. RICHARDSON: No, we haven't discussed it.

COMM. SLAASH: Okay.
CHAIRMAN RAMOS: Okay. And the --
COMM. SLASH: It's normally a
10:00-to-12:00 situation.
CHAIRMAN RAMOS: And then the Martin
Luther King celebration is on that Monday?
MS. RICHARDSON: I believe so. I believe so.

COMM. SLASH: The service generally -- the service project falls with that. The placing of the wreath is on Friday.

CHAIRMAN RAMOS: Okay. All right. So, put that on your calendar. Both are great events to participate in. I know all of you have, so no news there.

The next item is on the Announcements. Do we have any announcements?

MR. GILES: Excuse me. My name is

Virgil Giles, and I'm the Deputy Director for External Affairs, and the wreath placement date is the 15th, the Statehouse ceremony is on the 16 th, and the 20 th is the day of service.

COMM. HARRINGTON: Can you state those again?

MR. GILES: Yes. The wreath placement is on January 15th, the Statehouse ceremony is on the 16 th , and the day of service is on the 20th.

COMM. SLASH: Awesome.
CHAIRMAN RAMOS: So, Virgil, you're picking up with the communications and all of that good stuff?

MR. GILES: Correct.
CHAIRMAN RAMOS: Okay. So, again, welcome. We're glad that you're here. I believe Lisa's still around as well; correct?

MR. GILES: Yeah, she's contracting by paid media.

CHAIRMAN RAMOS: Okay. So, one of the things that $I$ found in conversations with Commissioners -- I've met with some of the other

Commissioners in the Cultural Affairs, with the Native American and the -- actually the Martin Luther King Commission.

We're just trying to get a good sense of -- know what's going on with them and how we can be of help as a collective group, and they have a lot of other things that are going on that we don't always see. There are a couple of major Native American events that happened in the November time frame.

MR. GILES: Yes.
CHAIRMAN RAMOS: One was on a
Saturday and one was on a Tuesday, which was a breakfast with the legislature. And it would be neat if we could get all those into our community thing, so if we would like to attend one for the men or for the Native Americans or for the Latinos, it's just kind of nice to know those things are out there. I know we all have a lot of things going on, but it's nice to be able to participate.

COMM. SLASH: I was going to say you guys can also include us in a calendar
appointment. If you have --
MS . RICHARDSON: Okay.
COMM. SLASH: -- one on the staff, just include us in that.

MR. GILES: Okay.
COMM. SLASH: We would gladly take a calendar appointment.

MR. GILES: Okay. I apologize for any miscommunication before me, but that won't happen while I'm here, so --

CHAIRMAN RAMOS: You know that's on public record.

MR. GILES: It's on public record. I stand by my name.

COMM. SLASH: You cannot offend us by sending a calendar appointment.

MR. GILES: Okay. All right.
CHAIRMAN RAMOS: And do you do that, Virgil, for all of the Commissions?

MR. GILES: Yes. All of the Commissions report directly to me, and I support them and all of the statutes.

CHAIRMAN RAMOS: Okay. Good.

COMM. SLASH: I'll see them before I leave anyway.

MR. GILES: Okay. Thank you.
CHAIRMAN RAMOS: You're welcome. We appreciate that.

MR. GILES: Thank you.
CHAIRMAN RAMOS: And are there any other events, now that we have you, that are coming up in the next 60 days that we should have on our calendars?

MR. GILES: Yes. The Indiana Young Black Males Matters Conference, that's going to be February 25th, and I have a location. That's going to be at the Statehouse, and that's going to be from 9:30 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. And then everything else is starting in early April, and I'll make sure that you get all of that information.

CHAIRMAN RAMOS: Okay.
COMM. SLASH: Thank you.
CHAIRMAN RAMOS: Commissioners -- I'm sorry. Vice-Chair Slash, the 21st of February I will be out of the country, so if you would put
that on your plate to chair that --
COMM. SLASH: Got it.
CHAIRMAN RAMOS: -- I would
appreciate it.
Any other announcements?
(No response.)
CHAIRMAN RAMOS: Any public comment?
(No response.)
CHAIRMAN RAMOS: Hearing none,
nothing else to cover, then I motion to adjourn.
All right. Thank you.
