this on the report, the dates of our holiday, where we sent an invite out, though I'll have Virgil send out another invite, though, with the locations.

We just had to work out a few irons, especially coming back from the pandemic, and a lot of places are still planning to get full, so some of the activities we're not totally sure of at this moment.

But as far as the actual event itself and the wreath placing, which is moved from -normally we do it the day before the event, but we're going to do it Sunday before Dr. King's holiday on the Circle because of the NCAA tournament that's here. And so, they're going to be using the Tournament -- I mean using the Circle for some other activities.

So, anyway, we're still excited. That's one of our -- what we say our signature events that we do every year. We hope you'll come and join us if you're able to, especially on Sunday when we put the wreath there. And we think we have some great partners who are involved in that
wreath placing.
I think you'll find the event we do for Dr. King at the actual ceremony on that Thursday with -- we're going to do something different. We have a very creative External Affairs team, and I think they've put together some great programming for that day.

Also we've been getting some new technology. If you look at our screen versus yours, and you'll see it's a lot clearer than others. So, that's no brag, I'm just -- that's just the technology. It's nothing to do with me, but we're trying to put new technology in place to come up -- stay in the 21st Century, where we can actually be a little bit more successful with our virtual programs. But that's a focus for Virgil and the team.

Again -- look, I'm not going to read through all of this, because it would take forever, and actually I sent out more sheets than I really anticipated doing, but on there you'll see some great things, especially when it comes to our Facebook reach and our Twitter
impressions, like 4.9 thousand Twitter impressions and -- now, this is in October -- and Facebook, 410,000. I mean we really have been pushing the envelope when it comes to our social media. And right now we're still in the middle of our campaign, and I don't know if any of you had the opportunity to be hit by some of the notices on our social media posts advertising our organi -- our operation here.

So, with that -- but anyway, right now the focus is just on MLK and working toward what we're going to do when it comes to marketing and outreach, which we're going to start doing the outreach again, it probably starts in February, where we go to libraries, community centers and set up for that day, making it easier, so those who want to talk to us or file a complaint don't have to come downtown and face the hustle and bustle of downtown, but we're going to do it somewhere close to them.

We do it all over town, but we'll be doing it around the state, we'll have a couple of things going on. Our outreach van will be going
around the state, strategically going around the state, to places that we've identified as needing to do some outreach there, and then we'll have the local component here in Indianapolis and our doughnut counties. So, that's going to be starting up in February.

But we're really excited. We've done some great things here. We're back in business as far as people coming to the office, and we've seen the uptick in complaints, especially in Fair Housing, so really excited about this upcoming year as far as us being able to reach out to people and make it a lot easier for them.

Also we're -- again, I think I mentioned that the portal was coming on-line, but it is on-line now, and so, the thing about the portal, since we've put it up, I mean we're constantly getting complaints coming from out there, and we've only marketed thus far on one radio program.

And for those who don't know, we go on Arame once a month, but we're going to do a marketing campaign about the portal. The on-line
portal allows people just to go on-line, go into that portal system, file their complaint, and then what's key about it, we also have Google Translate, so we know that any language, you would be able to go in and fill out that complaint.

And also, too, is the Docusign, hopefully by the end of this month that should be operational, and so, that will allow us to send documents out to be signed, not going through the mail, making it a lot quicker turnaround, and that will make everything a lot faster when it comes to processing inquiries.

So, there's just a lot going on here.
Again, we're trying to upgrade our technology. The Case Management System, I told you when I first came aboard, I think, you know, not many people on the Commission was there then, but one of the things I said, I wanted to implement a Case Management System, and we have that in place, and actually it's moving forward and everybody now is utilizing the system, and hopefully we can streamline things to make this
process a lot faster and more customer service friendly.

So, that's where we are right now, and if you have any questions of me, Commissioners, feel free to ask.

CHAIRPERSON SLASH: Thank you so much for that update. I'm looking forward to a lot of things that are coming in the coming year. Is there a goal of interaction from the public with the portal?

MR. WILSON: Well, right now through the test, we'll kind of get a better understanding. I mean we've been working the whole time to release it. The goal is twofold. One is, of course, we want -- this is going to be a faster process, so we can eliminate a lot of the paper compliance, because even if they come into the office, we're setting up a computer system here up front, when you first come in. We'll have a space set aside, so they can come in and enter the data -- I mean enter the information right into that, trying to make this -- streamline it, make it less paper.

I mean we want less paper. I mean that is -- that's everybody's goal. Now, we understand that's not going to be all of the time, and we understand that some people don't have access to the technologies. That's why we're doing the campaigns outside of here, so we can assist and help them. And wherever we go set up, we'll take it.

But it's to reduce the amount of time for the whole process, because mailing things back and forth takes a lot of time, and that's where a lot of our days get lost. And we want to act on a complaint -- or an inquiry, excuse me -- as fast as possible, so we think this will help a lot. And then we'll kind of figure out what this looks like as we get it in play and up and going. CHAIRPERSON SLASH: Thank you.

Any other questions from Commissioners regarding the Director's Report?

COMM. RAMOS: Not a question, but I commend the Commission on the advancement and the technology. As a tech guru, I always value that, and we can see the productivity, even in our
meetings. With the new processes, it's so much easier to link on it and open it, versus, you know, a few years ago, when we were still doing paper, and even some other attempts at electronics. So, congratulations for your job.

CHAIRPERSON SLASH: Absolutely.
MR. WILSON: And then also you can see, we're not going to all be wearing blinking lights like you see in the background there, so I'll just let you know.

And then also, I want to introduce the Commission to our new Deputy Director and General Counsel. He started -- it seems like he's been here already four or five months, but that's what happens when you start working here.

So, David, will you introduce yourself? MR. FLEISCHHACKER: Yeah, absolutely. Hi, Commissioners and Chair Slash. My name is David Fleischhacker. I'm the new Deputy Director and General Counsel for the Civil Rights Commission. I'm looking forward to working with all of you and with all of our staff here in advancing our goals.

I come here from State Personnel. I also have a history with the Department of Correction and with the Attorney General's Office.

Hello, Comm. Tolliver. Good to see you again. We overlap there a little bit.

But I'm looking forward, again, to working with all of you.

CHAIRPERSON SLASH: Thank you. Glad to have you. Look forward to working with you as well, and hope we can be as helpful and true partners as we have been with our previous Deputy Director. So, thank you.

MR. WILSON: And David brings a lot to here, to the Civil Rights. I mean he has a background also with -- especially with employment cases and handling a lot of the state's employment issues.

So, we're glad to have him on board and excited about what's going to happen in 2022; right? I mean we call this year a refresh, since we just got back in the office. We're trying to look at things from another -- through another lens.

So, this is a good time to have him coming on board so he can help in looking at how we can continue to do things better, because, again, I feel like we've come a long way, and it's a lot of painstaking and growth there, but I mean we do feel that we've done a lot, so --

CHAIRPERSON SLASH: Thank you so much for all of that.

If there are any other concerns or questions for the ICRC staff at this time with regards to the ICRC Director's report?
(No response.)
CHAIRPERSON SLASH: Okay. Hearing none, we'll move on to Old Business. As was announced, we have six Old Business cases that were assigned at the last meeting. We'll begin with Antrobus versus Southern Manor Apartments, Case HOse20110837. It was assigned to Vice-Chair Ramos.

COMM. RAMOS: Madam Chair, in the case of Antrobus versus Southern Manor Apartments, it's a bit more complex than many of our cases, so I'm going to address them, each of
them, in issues.
CHAIRPERSON SLASH: Okay.
COMM. RAMOS: So, the first issue has to do with whether or not Respondent discriminated against the Complainant on the basis of the Complainant's sex, female, or by creating a hostile environment, and in that case, I recommend that we uphold the Executive Director's finding of -- of -- sorry -- of no reasonable cause under the Indiana Fair Housing Act and no probable cause under the Indiana Civil Rights Law.

CHAIRPERSON SLAASH: Okay. Is there a second recommendation inside this case, or are those the two recommendations?

COMM. RAMOS: So, the other one is -deals with a probable cause, so I would recommend that we vote on them separately.

CHAIRPERSON SLASH: Okay.
We have heard the recommendation. Is
there a motion?
COMM. BLACKBURN: I move we accept
the recommendation.
