Dear Mr. Betley,

Please consider this a formal request to amend our application to change the location of The Excel Center from East Chicago to Hammond opening this fall; and to change the site name from Excel Center – East Chicago to Excel Center - Hammond.

In a letter dated November 22, 2016, the Indiana Charter School Board notified Goodwill LEADS, Inc. regarding approval to open an Excel Center, Fall of 2017 in East Chicago. During our research into the need for an Excel Center in Lake County, we recognized a need for more than one Excel Center in the county. The data indicated several communities in Lake County with significant numbers of adults (18 and older) without a high school diploma including Gary, East Chicago and Hammond. Relevant data for each of these communities were noted in the charter application submitted in the Fall of 2016.

Initial inroads, regarding potential sites, resulted in our request for a location in East Chicago. However, those potential sites became unavailable within a few months following the ICSB Board's approval. We immediately began searching for other potential sites through realtors and local connections. After a few weeks of not being able to locate property that met our needs in East Chicago, we extended our search into neighboring Hammond. Although it took a significant amount of time, we recently identified a location in Hammond located approximately four miles from one of the East Chicago sites that had been considered.

The Hammond site (3434 169th Street) is served by the East Chicago Transit system. We met with the ECT Director who indicated they will support this location. We also met with Gary Public Transit, which provides public transportation for Hammond; they are also willing to support us as needed. This public transportation system will allow prospective students from Hammond, East Chicago and Gary access to the Excel Center – Hammond.

The need for an Excel Center in Hammond:

- Graduation rates: The School City of Hammond 82.3%; among the lowest in Lake Countyⁱ
- Adults (18+) without a high school diploma: 20.4%, equating to 11,890 individuals ⁱ
- Poverty rate: 24.9%ⁱ
- Unemployment: Hammond 6.8%; Indiana 4.1% (February 2017 data)ⁱⁱ

Community Engagement

Community interest in The Excel Center has grown through conversations with local leaders as Goodwill LEADS representatives have shared its success in South Bend. Hammond community leaders have demonstrated sincere interest in an adult learner high school that serves those who have previously dropped out of high school, enabling them to graduate with a Core 40 diploma, certifications and post-secondary credentials.

Goodwill LEADS representatives have met with several organizations in Hammond to engage the community and have been met with enthusiastic responses regarding the positive potential of The Excel Center to impact their residents.
