Please join us at this special commemoration of NACW's 45th Anniversary when two remarkable athletes will speak about *Leadership through Sports*. Fourteen year old, Mo'Ne Davis is the first African-American girl to play in the Little League World Series, the first girl to earn a win and to pitch a shutout in Little League World Series history and the first Little League baseball player to appear on the cover of *Sports Illustrated* as a Little League player. Starr Foster was named assistant women's tennis coach at Georgetown University in 2011 and as a coach in program operation for two seasons. She currently is a Youth Development and High Performance Coach at Georgetown. When off the court Starr produces and moderates radio sports shows for youth and professional athletes. She has also developed a Non-profit organization called TLC (Tennis Legacy Club) for girls' empowerment and self-esteem.
