



Environmental Management 101 (E101)

Environmental Management 101 (E101) is an intensive introductory environmental management course oriented towards the professional seeking environmental management experience. This course will:

- Introduce environmental rules and regulations
- Enable appropriate rule/regulation research and interpretation
- Explain the appropriate applications of a variety of rules and regulations
- Provide information that will enable appropriate decision making

This course is designed to provide professionals with the tools necessary to enable compliance with applicable environmental rules and regulations. Coursework will include:

- Interactive lectures
- Homework involving written materials
- In class exercises applying the information learned from written materials and interactive lectures
- Homework applying the information learned to your facility or to the sample facility provided

At the completion of the course, participants should be able to:

- Determine the environmental compliance of their facility
- Undertake all activities necessary to achieve compliance for their facility
- Perform any necessary research to either determine compliance or to achieve compliance for their facility
- Utilize all resources available to assist in environmental compliance efforts
- Network with other professionals regarding environmental issues
- Explain compliance issues to a variety of management staff and personnel
- Achieve cost savings for their organization through the application of professional environmental management and pollution prevention activities

The course is taught in four (4) or five (5) sessions lasting 4 to 6 hours long. Each session is conducted by professional environmental staff from the Compliance and Technical Assistance Program (CTAP) of the Indiana Department of Environmental Management's (IDEM's) Office of Pollution Prevention and Technical Assistance (OPPTA).
