While at Logansport Juvenile Correctional Facility, _____ will participate in the Department's Division of Youth Services Case Management System by beginning the Intake Assessment Phase.

During the Intake Assessment Phase various information pertaining to _____ is obtained and used to develop an Intake Assessment Report. The report is then utilized by various staff throughout _____'s commitment, and serves as a guide in the classification process, in the establishment of treatment goals, in education placement, and in the establishment of aftercare services.

At the conclusion of the Intake Assessment Phase, _____ will be classified to a facility which is most appropriate to meet his needs.

While at Logansport Juvenile Correctional Facility, _____ will be provided clothing and hygiene items. He will have access to the telephones every day except Monday and Wednesday's and will be given four (4) stamped envelopes. He may also receive mail at 1118 South St Rd 25 Logansport, IN 46947. Please be aware that when sending letters to our students, they CANNOT be written on colored paper or sent in colored envelopes. They cannot receive greeting cards or stickers of any kind including return address labels. All Correspondence must be sent in plain white envelopes (NO security envelopes). The letter must be on plain white, lined paper (no photocopies or printer paper). Any correspondence not meeting this criteria will be confiscated before reaching the student.

VISITATION INFORMATION

Visitation will be available for LEGAL GUARDIAN on Saturdays from 8 AM-10 AM and from 2 PM- 4 PM EST and Sundays 8 AM-10 AM at the INTAKE UNIT AT 729 HIGH STREET, LOGANSPORT, IN 46947. You must bring VALID PHOTO ID and ADHERE TO THE DRESS CODE REGULATIONS ENCLOSED. Also once youth has been classified to his treatment facility at the end of his stay at Intake please make sure you fully fill out the visitation forms and mail back to that facility. REMEMBER ONLY LEGAL GUARDIAN ALLOWED. PARK ON SIDE PARKING LOT AND USE BUSINESS ENTRANCE.

The Department of Youth Services (DYS) is part of a Performance Based Standards, (www.pbstandards.org) which research has shown that your involvement during your child's stay with DYS has a positive effect on his behavior both here and upon his return to your home. It will have a positive effect and could reduce his chances to re-offend as well as reduce the likelihood of other youth within the same household of committing a crime. We strongly encourage you to visit the website noted above to gain better understanding of our mission and goals. Please feel free to call and talk with staff and service providers whenever you have questions or concerns. It is imperative that we have your contact information, a home phone, cell phone, and email address so that we may keep in contact with you regarding your child's progress. Please take time to visit your child as much as possible and keep the lines of communication open and free flowing with facility staff. If you are having difficulty with the phone system or visitation hours please contact the facility to discuss accommodations or assistance.

LOGANSFORT JUVENILE CORRECTIONAL FACILITY

Your son was recently returned to the Logansport Juvenile Correctional Facility on a community supervision violation. **THIS FACILITY IS LOCATED AT 729 High Street, Logansport, IN 46947 (map enclosed and driving directions enclosed).**

Please read the following general guidelines before visiting Logansport Juvenile Correctional Facility.

1. Visitors will only be permitted during the community supervision violator's parole revocation hearing.
2. Visitors must enter the visiting area at their own risk and the Department of Correction shall assume no responsibility for injury.
3. Visitors are required to produce picture identification.
4. All visitors shall follow directions of facility staff. Visitors shall be permitted to stay until the offender has gone before the parole revocation committee. After the offender has gone before the parole revocation committee, the offender shall be permitted to say goodbye to visitors and visitors shall be escorted from the facility.
5. Offenders and visitors are to refrain from excessive displays of emotion. Embracing is allowed at the beginning and end of the visit. Holding hands during the visit is permissible.
6. Disruptive or offensive behavior could result in termination of the visit.
7. Visitors may not bring any items, food or gifts to the students. Visitors are not permitted to give money to the students during visits. Trafficking with a student is a violation of IC 34-44-3-9.
8. No purses, packages, or other bundles will be allowed in the facility. The only items allowed into the facility by visitors are personal identification and car keys. All other items shall remain in the vehicle.
9. Violators are subject to search. Students will be searched following the Parole Revocation hearing.
10. **NO ONE UNDER THE AGE OF EIGHTEEN** shall be permitted to enter this facility.

Visitors dress code requirements

Visitors shall wear clothing that reflects the acceptable standard of the facility and which pose no threat to the security, custody or maintenance of order at the facility. In the case of a disagreement regarding the appropriateness of a visitor's clothing, the facility custody staff on duty during the Parole Revocation hearings shall make the determination if a visitor's clothing is acceptable or unacceptable.

Female visitors:

1. Shoes must be worn by visitors.
2. Shorts, tube tops, and halter tops will not be permitted.
3. Proper undergarments are required. Sheer blouses are permitted only if worn with a camisole.
4. No head attire is permitted except as part of a religious practice.
5. No gang related clothing is permitted.

Male visitors:

1. Shoes and shirts must be worn.
2. No head attire is permitted except as part of a religious practice.
3. Shorts will not be permitted.
4. No gang related clothing is permitted.

ONLY LEGAL GUARDIANS, PARENTS OR CUSTODIANS are permitted at the parole revocation hearing. Persons who are on parole/probation can only attend with written approval of his/her supervising agent and the superintendent of this facility.

UPON RELEASE OF THE OFFENDER FROM THIS FACILITY, IT WILL BE THE RESPONSIBILITY OF THE PARENT/GUARDIAN TO SIGN ANY RELEASE PAPERS NECESSARY AND TO PROVIDE TRANSPORTATION FOR HIS RETURN HOME.

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DRESS STANDARDS: Legal guardian shall wear clothing that poses no threat to the security, custody or maintenance of order at the facility. The facility staff on duty during visitation shall make the determination if a visitor's clothing is acceptable or unacceptable. The following standards are to be met:

- Undergarments must be worn at all times.
- Shoes must be worn.
- Tight fitting, such as stirrup, lycra pants, or leggings shall not be worn.
- Dresses, skirts, or shorts must be no shorter than two (2) inches above the knee and not have deep slits.
- Halter or tank tops, tube tops, sheer, see-through, or low-cut clothing is not permitted.
- Guardians must wear a shirt/blouse with sleeves.
- No clothing with security threat group detailing is permitted.
- No jewelry, except a wedding band or set, may be worn in the visitation area.
- Hats or other head coverings are not permitted, except as required by religious beliefs.
- No heavy coats or sweaters will be permitted in the visitation area.

ITEMS NOT PERMITTED: Guardians shall not be permitted to possess or carry the following items into the visitation area: Firearms, weapons, knives, ammunition, narcotics, medication (unless the medication is life-saving or life-sustaining, such as nitroglycerin pills, oxygen bottles, bee sting kits, inhalers, etc), controlled substances, alcoholic beverages, marijuana, tobacco and tobacco related items, cameras, video and audio recording equipment and electronic devices, including, but not limited to: cameras, cellular telephones, pagers, blackberries, radios, tape recorders, etc.

TRAFFICKING: The giving or receiving of any item(s) to/from youth without prior approval of staff shall be considered trafficking. Guardians caught trafficking with youth shall be subject to arrest and criminal prosecution and the permanent denial of visits with any youth under the jurisdiction of the Department of Correction.

DIRECTIONS ENCLOSED:

DIRECTIONS TO LOGANSFORT JUVENILE FACILITY

FROM INDIANAPOLIS: Take {421 North} straight into Logansport. Do not turn off this road until reaching Logansport. You will see an area that will say **Frankfort 421 going east but DO NOT TURN**. 421 will also say 329 and 29 and eventually turns into Burlington Avenue. Go through the stoplight at the intersection of Burlington Ave and Main St. Cross over the bridges & railroad tracks and the next stoplight will be at the intersection of South 3rd St and 24 or W. Market. Go through that and the next intersection with a stoplight will be 3rd St and Broadway. On the right about ½ block you will see the County Government Bldg. There is a cannon in the side yard. Immediately after passing the building turn right or east on the road adjacent to the building. This will be High St. If you cross over another bridge you have gone too far. Take High St east and you will come to a stoplight at the intersection of 6th St and High St. Continue through the light. You should pass a **Fire Station** on the left between 6th St and 7th St. Directly after passing 7th St turn into our parking lot which is on the right side of the road.

FROM INDIANAPOLIS: Take {31 North} to north side of Kokomo. Turn left to {35 North} taking you through Galveston and Walton. At south edge of Logansport turn right onto 435 (Logansport Rd). At the flashing light at 18th Street turn right onto 18th Street. Staying on 18th St continue until you come to High Street and turn left on High Street following it west until you pass 8th St. Our building is on the corner of 8th St and High St. Turn left into our parking lot.

FROM LAFAYETTE: Take {25 East} passing Logansport State Hospital Grounds after which you will come to a 3-way stop. Turn left and 25 now becomes N. Cicott St. Cross bridge and go to stop light at West Market Street {24 West}. Make a right turn onto West Market. Go across a bridge and at earliest convenience merge to the left lane. At the first stop light turn left. This will be at the intersection of South 3rd St and 24 west or W. Market. The next intersection with a stoplight will be 3rd St and Broadway. On the right about ½ block you will see the County Government Bldg. There is a cannon in the side yard. Immediately after passing the building turn right or east on the road adjacent to the building. This will be High St. If you cross over another bridge you have gone too far. Take High St east and you will come to a stoplight at the intersection of 6th St and High St. Continue through the light. You should pass a **Fire Station** on the left between 6th St and 7th St. Directly after passing 7th St turn into our parking lot which is on the right side of the road.

FROM SOUTH BEND: Take {31 South} to the outskirts of Rochester to {25 South}. 25 South runs straight into Logansport after going through some small towns such as Fulton and Metea. You will pass Memorial Hospital on the right. There is a stoplight at 6th St and Michigan Avenue {25 South}. Take a left at that intersection and go over the bridge to the stop light at the intersection of 6th St and High St. Turn left onto High St. You should pass a **Fire Station** on the left between 6th St and 7th St. Directly after passing 7th St turn into our parking lot which is on the right side of the road.

FROM BLOOMINGTON: Take {37 North} to {465 North} **TO 421 NORTH**. Take {421 North} straight into Logansport. Do not turn off this road until reaching Logansport. You will see an area that will say **Frankfort 421 going east but DO NOT TURN**. 421 will also say 329 and 29 and eventually turns into Burlington Avenue. Go through the stoplight at the intersection of Burlington Ave and Main St. Cross over the bridges & railroad tracks and the next stoplight will be at the intersection of South 3rd St and 24 or W. Market. Go through that and the next intersection with a stoplight will be 3rd St and Broadway. On the right about ½ block you will see the County Government Bldg. There is a cannon in the side yard. Immediately after passing the building turn right or east on the road adjacent to the building. This will be High St. If you cross over another bridge you have gone too far. Take High St east and you will come to a stoplight at the intersection of 6th St and High St. Continue through the light. You should pass a **Fire Station** on the left between 6th St and 7th St. Directly after passing 7th St turn into our parking lot which is on the right side of the road.

FROM FORT WAYNE: Take {69 South} to {24 South} to {24 West}. You will pass the outskirts of Huntington, Wabash and Peru on 24. Once you pass the outskirts of Peru you can either proceed to take **OLD 24** or **NEW 24**.

If you take Old 24 you will see a turn off that says **LOGANSFORT** to the right of 24. There is gray barn with a design on the roof near this turn. Follow old 24 into Logansport. You will pass a cemetery called Bverrest on the right. Continue on 24 heading west toward Logansport. At the 1st stoplight at the intersection of 24 and Yorktown Rd make a right hand turn. Follow it to High St and turn left. Continue on High St following it west until you pass 8th St. Our building is on the corner of 8th St and High St. Turn left into our parking lot.

If you take New 24 rather than turning right off 24 at the sign that says Logansport continue on 24 all the way around until you come to a **STOP**. This will be at 24 and HWY 35 South. Turn right onto HWY 35 south and at south edge of Logansport turn right onto 435 (Logansport Rd). At the flashing light at 18th Street turn right onto 18th Street. Staying on 18th St continue until you come to High Street and turn left on High Street following it west until you pass 8th St. Our building is on the corner of 8th St and High St. Turn left into our parking lot.

Q: WILL I RECEIVE A MONTHLY STATEMENT?

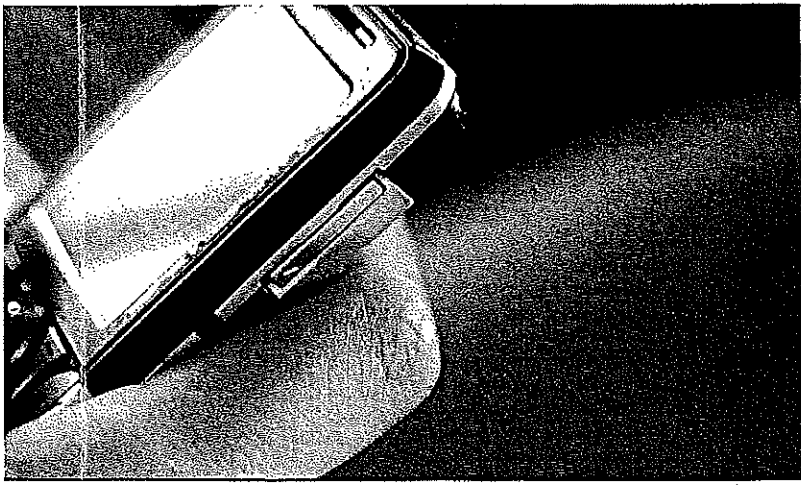

-  DON'T attempt a 3-way call
-  DON'T try to transfer the call
-  DON'T put the offender on hold
-  DON'T use or answer "call waiting"
-  DON'T press numbers on the touch tone pad during the call (on both offender phone and called party phones)
-  DON'T stop the conversation for any length of time because even short pauses may result in a disconnection

Once a number has been blocked, only the person the number is listed to may unblock the number by calling:

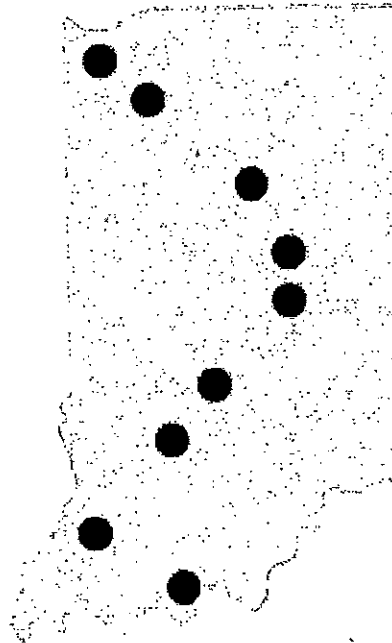
Trips to the following correctional facilities will be scheduled when a sufficient number of riders are secured:

What is Performance-based Standards (PbS)?

Performance-based Standards (PbS) is a nation-wide improvement system being used by youth detention and correctional facility managers to improve conditions for both youth and staff in facilities. The Indiana Department of Correction, Division of Youth Services participates in this improvement system.

What does this have to do with me?

PbS conducts surveys with youth, staff and families to analyze data on facility safety, education, fairness, rehabilitation programming, health/mental health services and planning for the youths to return to the community.

The data gathered is used to identify issues and problems, which then helps make changes to improve practices in the facilities to better serve youth and families.

Upon your child's release, you will be asked to participate in the Family Survey. This facility asks families and people who support youths who are incarcerated for their perceptions and experiences regarding the quality of life and services in the facility. Your answers will help us to a better job of working with families in the future. We appreciate your feedback on the overall experience with the facility while your child or loved one was here. Your opinions about the facility are extremely important to us. Your participation in the Family Survey is completely voluntary and your responses and comments will be kept completely anonymous and confidential. Neither your name nor your child's name will be associated with the survey information.
