## **ORDER 2009-134**

## AN ORDER OF THE INDIANA GAMING COMMISSION CONCERNING THE VOLUNTARY EXCLUSION PROGRAM CASE NO. VEP-09-77

On or about February 10, 2006, John Doe #77 submitted an application to the Indiana Gaming Commission ("Commission") to participate in the Voluntary Exclusion Program for a minimum of one year. Pursuant to 68 IAC 6-3-2(d), if a patron does not request removal from the program after the expiration of the program term, he or she remains validly in the program. Under 68 IAC 6-3-2(g), a participant in the program agrees that if he or she violates the terms of the program and enters the gaming area of a facility under the jurisdiction of the Commission he or she willingly forfeits any jackpot or thing of value won as a result of a wager made at any facility under the jurisdiction of the Commission. The casino must withhold forfeited winnings and remit them to the Commission, which collects the funds.

On or about June 3, 2009, John Doe #77 was discovered to be present at Majestic Star Casino ("Majestic Star"). At that time, John Doe #77 had \$30.00 in his possession. Majestic Star withheld the winnings as required by Commission regulations and seeks Commission approval for remittance, less applicable taxes, in fulfillment of John Doe #77's voluntary exclusion application.

The Commission, after reviewing this matter:

## **APPROVES**

the remittance of the winnings in the amount of \$30.00, less applicable taxes, in fulfillment of John Doe #77's voluntary exclusion application.

Pursuant to IC 4-21.5-3-5, this ORDER becomes effective 15 days following receipt of the Order of the Indiana Gaming Commission.
