Weatherization Reopen Guidance

The following guidance provides details on the dates and conditions under which IHCDA permits sub-grantees to begin providing in-home weatherization services. This guidance **does not require** that sub-grantees begin providing in-home services according to this timeline, but rather provides a date on which programs may open at the earliest, according to each individual agency's discretion – when both county and agency leadership believe it is safe to do so.

- 1) Agencies may provide in-home weatherization according to the regulations below in homes that DO NOT have occupants that are considered high risk and/or elderly (65 years old or older) (according to CDC guidance) starting the day the county the home is located in reaches Stage 4 of Indiana's Back on Track plan.
- 2) Agencies may provide in-home weatherization according to the regulations below in all homes starting the day the county the home is located in reaches Stage 5 of Indiana's Back on Track plan.
- 3) In all cases, Weatherization services should resume no earlier than June 14, 2020.

In order to reopen sub-grantees must adhere to CDC safety guidelines, must have completed the following requirements, and must have the following protocols in place.

- All Weatherization professionals (including all Weatherization Program Managers) must complete a COVID-19 safety class provided by INCAA before resuming in-home weatherization services
- All sub-grantees must have an OSHA aligned Respiratory Protection and Safety Plan in policy before proceeding with Weatherization work.
 - For proper PPE guidelines, weatherization professionals should reference the <u>SWS</u>, <u>OSHA</u> Standards, and <u>CDC</u> guidelines









- Safety procedures to prevent the spread of infectious diseases should be in line with <u>CDC guidance</u>
- Weatherization professionals must wear proper personal protective equipment at all times while in a client's home, according to their agency's Respiratory Protection and Safety Plan.
- All sub-grantees must have an existing employee health screening policy on file before entering client homes.
