## **Opportunity for Public Comment on Indianapolis Power & Light Rate Case**

Field hearing scheduled for March 16 at 6 p.m.; OUCC educational session to begin at 5:30 p.m.

- **What:** A field hearing will be held in Indianapolis by the Indiana Utility Regulatory Commission (IURC) to hear from the public on Indianapolis Power & Light's rate case petition, under IURC Cause No. 44576.
- When: March 16, 2015 at 6 p.m. EDT. Prior to the hearing, the Office of Utility Consumer Counselor (OUCC) will hold an educational session at 5:30 p.m. EDT.

Where: Crispus Attucks Medical Magnet High School, 1140 W. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. St., Indianapolis, IN 46202

- Why: Indianapolis Power & Light has filed a petition before the IURC for a new schedule of rates and charges.
- **How:** During field hearings, ratepayers have the opportunity to speak directly to the IURC or submit written comments.
