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## The IURC Hosts Forum on Natural Gas Research and Development

Gas Technology Institute (GTI) highlights needs specific to Indiana

**INDIANAPOLIS** – In a forum on natural gas research and development, GTI highlighted how Indiana can utilize increased-efficiency equipment, reduce emissions, enhance the integrity of the natural gas system, improve public and gas consumer safety, and reduce the costs of maintaining aging transmission and distribution infrastructure.

The Indiana Utility Regulatory Commission (IURC) regulates the rates and charges of twenty-two natural gas utilities in Indiana. Additionally, its Pipeline Safety Division has the authority to regulate the infrastructure that transports the natural gas.

The presentation was an opportunity for the IURC and GTI to discuss issues specific to the natural gas industry. Additionally, the presentation provided updates on the status of projected greenhouse gas emissions, federal legislation, energy pricing and technology used to improve overall efficiency in the transportation and distribution of natural gas resources.
