


The Court has been informed of the passing of the Honorable Gregory Caldwell, Judge of the Noblesville City Court. As a result, we find that in the interest of continuing the orderly administration of justice and pursuant to Ind. Trial Rule 63, Judges *Pro Tempore* should be appointed temporarily to discharge the duties of his office. Further, this Court has been advised that the Honorable Judith S. Proffitt, Jerry M. Barr, and Daniel J. Pfleging are willing to serve as Judges *Pro Tempore* in the court.

IT IS, THEREFORE ORDERED that:

1. the Honorable Judith S. Proffitt is appointed as Judge *Pro Tempore* in the Noblesville City Court on November 1, 8, and 15, 2016;
2. the Honorable Jerry M. Barr is appointed as Judge *Pro Tempore* in the Noblesville City Court on November 29, December 6, 13, and 20, 2016;
3. the Honorable Daniel J. Pfleging is appointed as Judge *Pro Tempore* in the Noblesville City Court on January 3, 2017, and every Tuesday thereafter;
4. this Order shall be sufficient authority for all Judges *Pro Tempore*, under Trial Rule 63(E), to appoint Judges *Pro Tempore* to serve in their place if necessary;
5. all appointments under this Order shall terminate upon a successor assuming the office or further Order of this Court;
6. all Judges *Pro Tempore* appointed under the terms of this Order shall have authority to continue the employment of court personnel and otherwise discharge the duties of Judge of the Noblesville City Court;
7. all Judges *Pro Tempore* appointed under the terms of this Order shall be entitled to compensation for their service, as provided in Trial Rule 63(D), paid from the funds of the City of Noblesville at the same rate and on the same schedule as applied to Judge Caldwell; and

8. Judges Proffitt, Barr, and Pfleging, while certified as senior judges, may claim senior judge credit, but not senior judge compensation, for their service by submitting the appropriate form and noting that it requests only senior judge credit.
