Biographical Note:

Shepard J. Crumpacker, Jr. the son of Grace Dauchy and Shepard J. Crumpacker was born on February 13, 1917 in South Bend, Indiana. He graduated from Northwestern University in 1938 and earned a law degree in 1941 from the University of Michigan. He began his law practice in South Bend, and then enlisted in the United States Army Air Corps where he served until 1946. Crumpacker married Marjorie Patton of Evanston Illinois on February 18, 1950. From 1958 until 1970, Crumpacker was a delegate to the Indiana State Republican conventions. He served in the United States Congress as a Representative from January 3, 1951 until January 3, 1957 in the 82nd, 83rd, and 84th Congresses. After his congressional service, he practiced law until he was elected judge of the St. Joseph Superior Court in 1977. Crumpacker died on October 14, 1986.

Throughout the collection, there are opinion polls from Crumpacker's constituents about U.S. policy issues and listings and records of his telegraph and telephone calls. There is an Illinois Waterway map for Little Calumet River by U.S. Army (Box 4, Folder 6)
