Biographical Note

William Grose was born December 16, 1812 in Dayton, Ohio. He moved to Fayette County, Indiana in 1817 and to Henry County, Indiana in 1829. He studied law and was admitted to the bar in 1843. He married Rebecca Needham, with whom he had 5 children, on December 22, 1836 in Henry County.

He served as a judge for the 11th circuit court in 1860-1861 and was commissioned Colonel of Company S of the 36th Regiment of the Indiana Volunteer Infantry on Aug. 30, 1861. On July 30, 1864 he was promoted as Brigadier General. On August 5, 1864, he was assigned to command the 3rd Brigade of the 1st Division of the 4th Army. He served with the Army of the Cumberland in all of its engagements. He was promoted to Brevet Major General on April 20, 1865 and was promoted to Major General August 16, 1865. He was mustered out on December 31, 1865.

President Johnson appointed him as Collector of Internal Revenue for the 5th Collection District, State of Indiana on May 4, 1866, serving until 1884. Rebecca died in 1879, and he married Martha J. Black on February 19, 1884 in Henry County. He was elected to the Indiana General Assembly as a representative in 1857, and 1887 and to the Senate in 1889 and 1891. He wrote several books about his war experiences. He applied for a pension as an invalid in 1890.

He died July 30, 1900 and is buried in the South Mound Cemetery, New Castle, Indiana.
