NOTICE OF UPCOMING ROAD SALT DEMAND AGGREGATE

For Winter Season 2016-2017

GENERAL INFORMATION

This notice is to inform the political subdivisions of the State of Indiana that the Indiana Department of Administration (IDOA) is preparing to initiate the 2016-2017 road salt demand aggregate on **Monday**, **March 07**, **2016**. This demand aggregate will assist the state in developing the 2016-2017 road salt bid.

HOW TO PARTICIPATE

More LEU Options Now Available

As you know, ISL is in the process of proposing changes to **the Librarian Certification rule**(590 IAC 5 --more details on ISL's Rulemaking Docket page). One of the areas of concern to the task force members was a need for greater flexibility in LEU-eligible activities. While we must wait for adoption of the new rule (anticipated date of January 1, 2017) before we may enact most of the changes, ISL is very excited to share with you the following:

Effective immediately, "specialist subjects of importance to library operations" will now include topics such as First Aid/Safety and foreign language acquisition. This means Indiana librarians can now earn LEUs for these trainings. Up to 10 LEUs per 5-year certificate period may be earned from training on

2016 Wabash Valley Community Read picks book by ISU professor Entities that would like to be included in the bid must provide volumes through the demand aggregation tool (similar to past years) on the OneIndiana website. Please note that your participation in this bid is a commitment to buy from this contract. Therefore, entities that provide tonnage will be required to purchase a minimum of 80% of the tonnage requested and are eligible to purchase up to a maximum of 120% of tonnage requested. For example, a 100 ton commitment equals a minimum purchase of 80 tons and a maximum purchase of 120 tons.

A follow-up email through OneIndiana will be sent on March 07, 2016 to announce the official start of the road salt demand aggregate.

For your review, below is the original announcement regarding anticipated changes to public librarian certification:

During the summer of 2015, Indiana library directors, staff, and trustees held two public meetings to discuss the successes and challenges related to certification since the rule changed in 2008. This task force of library directors, staff, and trustees came up with a list of recommended changes to improve the certification rule. In December 2015, the Indiana Library and Historical Board (ILHB) approved implementation of the task force's recommended rule changes and the State Library is now on the path to officially changing the certification rule.

The proposed changes to Rule # 15-446 Librarian Certification (590 IAC 5) will update the rule to remove obsolete language, clarify the rule, reduce the regulatory impact on librarians serving libraries with smaller populations, broaden the language related to LEUs to permit earning LEUs from a wider variety of sources, and provide for greater certification opportunities for librarians educated in other countries. You can read the proposed rule as well as a summary of the changes on the State Library's website. (See ISL's Rulemaking Docket page.)

The State Library hopes to host a public hearing this summer for public comment. The date and time are not yet set; we will notify the listservs and the Wednesday Word in advance so that colleagues may plan to attend. The meeting will be held at ISL (140 North Senate Avenue, Indianapolis, IN 46204).

Include in your statement a brief outline of your archival education and any work history, along with a description of your long-term professional goals. Open Forums on Digital Preservation

Is your organization creating or managing digital content? If so, are you aware that digital files become inaccessible over time unless they are managed and migrated to new technology as needed. Even content that resides on a web site or social media site is at risk. Technology changes and without a program for long-term preservation the intellectual content you are developing today will become inaccessible to the researchers of tomorrow.

Digital preservation combines policies, strategies and actions to ensure long-term access to content that is born digital or converted to digital form regardless of the challenges of file corruptions, media failure and technological change. Digital preservation is an ongoing process, not a one-time activity, and needs to be addressed programmatically.
