We truly appreciate the opportunity to talk with our State partners about all of the Stellar Community initiatives taking place throughout Huntingburg.

Despite the typical Indiana weather this winter, there has been major progress on one of our signature projects, Market Street Park. A majority of the underground infrastructure is in place, and the work above ground is finally visible. This project has been met with a variety of unforeseen circumstances, but with weekly progress meetings taking place between the various City departments, the contractor, and the engineer, we have been able to work together towards a completed project. Internally, we have begun to strategize programming, while also establishing rental rates for the various spaces throughout the park. The community continues to support this project, and I think everyone is looking forward to completion.

Unfortunately, we have experienced some disappointment with another Stellar project, the 4th Street Heritage Trail. We were confident in our estimate before going to bid in February; however, the bids came in much higher than we anticipated. This isn't stopping us, though. We have reviewed the project in great detail, and we are currently looking at alternate approaches to achieving the intended end-result. We have informed the public of our plan, and I believe we have the support we need to continue. We refuse to compromise the original purpose and goals of this project, and I am confident we will end up with a project that we can all be proud of!

We have other projects that have moved since we last met, from the "planning phase" to the "in progress phase," and I look forward to sharing with you the details of those projects today. Thank you for your support in helping us continue to be, "A City Like No Other!"





# STELLAR OUTCOMES

The City of Huntingburg has identified the following outcomes that will result from the Stellar activities:



# <sup>2</sup> St. Joseph Hospital Campus Redevelopment

- Activates a derelict building in the core of northside residential district
- Puts a significant property back on the tax role
- Revitalizes the northside business district
- Meets a critical need for affordable senior housing

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Senior Center

- Provides a larger facility to meet the needs of a growing senior population
- Is ideally located near senior housing projects and the Heritage Trail
- Allows for enhanced use of the Old Town Hall, the current location of the Senior Center



- Links key elements, including the Veterans Monument, to the community
- Provides recreation opportunity for all age groups, regardless of physical ability
- Connects neighborhoods to schools and businesses
- Provides for aging in place
- Promotes healthy communities
- Reduces vehicular traffi
- Adds a key component to our quality of life

- Maintenance / Emergency Shelter
- Relocates existing facility out of floodplai

2 14th Street Reconstruction

- Is needed to handle heavy truck and additional traffic expected when the Overpass Project is complet

- Enhances the use of Huntingburg Event and Community Center
- As part of the Heritage Trail, connects the Event and Community Center and Veterans Monument to the east side of Huntingburg and the St. Joseph Hospital Redevelopment Project

# **Hospital Redevelopment**

It was announced in April, that Crossroads Behavioral Health, a \$10 million behavioral health care facility will occupy the remaining vacant portion of the former St. Joseph's Hospital Building. Construction is underway, with an anticipated opening before the end of 2018. Development of this project is tied to current negotiations between property owners. A sub-committee has been formed and will become re-engaged once timelines have been established.


