**RE:** Redistricting – Metropolitan School District of Decatur Township

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**Recommendation:** Vote to approve Decatur's redistricting plan.

Decatur submitted the attached request for approval of the reapportionment of its three districts so that they are as equal as possible in population, as required by Indiana law based on the 2010 decennial census. Supporting materials are also attached.

Per the census, the old districts were divided in population as follows: 1) 19.9%, 2) 41.4%, and 3) 38.7%. With the change, the districts are now divided as follows: 1) 33.9%, 2) 32.4%, and 3) 33.7%.

Staff reviewed the plan and Decatur has modified the district boundaries so the three districts are very close to being exactly equal in population, thereby complying with applicable law.

5. Exhibit E: Current Board Member District Boundaries Described by Precinct, with attached district map.
6. Exhibit F: Proposed (New) Board Member District Boundaries Described by Precincts.

As discussed, although the district was originally formed under Metropolitan School District statute, (now codified at IC 20-23-7) the State Commission for the Reorganization of the School Corporation ("State Commission") determined by its own motion (Exhibit B) on March 18, 1965 that the district should be declared a Community School Corporation (now codified at IC 20-23-4) in accordance with Section 6a of that Act.

As noted in our discussions, all registered voters of the school district vote on all board members, but at least one (1), but not more than two (2) members may be elected from any board member district.

The statute pursuant to which the district was originally organized requires the boundaries of member districts to be equalized by population, (IC 20-23-7-4), but the Community School Corporation law does not require equal districts where, as here, all registered voters of the school district vote on all board members regardless of member district.

In any case, the school board desires to equalize their member districts based on the most recent federal decennial census, the 2010 census, and use the most recent official precinct designations which became effective in 2012, rather than real estate legal descriptions to describe the boundaries of the member districts because real estate legal descriptions are unintelligible to the lay public and require a surveyor to make future modifications.

As indicated in Exhibit E, only 19.9% of the district's population now resides in District 1, while 38.7% reside in District 3, and 41.47% in District 2.

The new board member district plan will create three (3) substantially equal districts as follows: District 1: 33.9%; District 2: 32.4%; and District 3: 33.7%, as set forth on Exhibit F.

Therefore, on behalf of the Metropolitan School District of Decatur Township, I request the school corporation's new redistricting plan be placed on the State Board of Education's August agenda for approval.

The Board vote on the redistricting resolution was unanimous and there has been no public opposition.

The new board member districts have been established in accordance with IC 20-23-4-35(f) and (g).

The submission of the enclosed redistricting resolution constitutes the certification of the new board member districts to the State Board of Education required by IC 20-23-4-35(h).

Favorable consideration to be placed on the State Board of Education's agenda for August and favorable consideration of the school corporation's redistricting plan as set forth in the enclosed resolution and accompanying exhibits would be most appreciated.

**Resolution Redistricting Metropolitan School District of Decatur Township Based on 2010  
Census**

Whereas, the Metropolitan School District of Decatur Township was initially created in 1964 pursuant to a reorganization resolution (Exhibit A) adopted by the Advisory Board and Trustee of Decatur Township pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 226 of the Acts of the General Assembly of Indiana, Acts 1949, as added by Acts 1955, Chapter 151, Section 1, as amended, in 1964; and

Whereas, the School Corporation reorganization resolution provides:

“Be It Further Resolved that one (1) member of each Metropolitan Board of Education hereafter elected to such office shall reside within each of such Board Member Districts, but no more than two (2) shall reside in any one (1) Board Member District. All members of such office shall be voted upon by all the registered voters of the Metropolitan School District voting at any school board member election. Candidates, who may succeed themselves for such office shall be resident free-holders of the Metropolitan School District; shall be at least thirty (30) years of age and shall be compensated for their services as board members, as is provided by the applicable provisions of such act, or any supplementary set or acts pertaining thereto. They shall also have been continuous residents for three (3) years.” and;

Whereas, The State Commission for the Reorganization of School Corporation, (the “State Commission”) created under the School Corporation Reorganization Act of 1959, Chapter 202, as amended, (the “Act”) determined by its own motion (Exhibit B) on March 18, 1965, that the Metropolitan School District of Decatur Township, Marion County, Indiana, an existing local school corporation in the State of Indiana (the “School Corporation”), should be declared a Community School Corporation in accordance with Section 6a of the Act; and that the said name of the Community School Corporation be the “Metropolitan School District of Decatur Township”; and,

Whereas, said Community School Corporation came into being on July 1, 1965; and

Whereas, the School Corporation was divided into three (3) board member districts as described in narrative form in attached Exhibit C; and

Whereas, the map of the current board member districts is depicted on Exhibit D; and

Whereas, the statute pursuant to which the School Corporation adopted its reorganization resolution is now codified in part at IC 20-23-7-5 (b)(2), which provides for a readjustment of the boundaries of member districts to equalize the districts by population, even though neither the Metropolitan School District statute pursuant to which the School Corporation was originally formed, nor the Community School Corporation statute, pursuant to which the State Commission declared the School Corporation a Community School District in March 18, 1965, require redistricting for board member districts where, as in Metropolitan School District of Decatur Township, all registered voters of the school district vote on all board members regardless of residency district; and

Whereas, the School Corporation reorganized following the 1980 and 1990 census in order to maintain as equal population in the three (3) board member districts as possible; and

Whereas, in the most recent federal census, the population by precinct of the three (3) currently existing board member districts as of the 2010 federal census is set forth in Exhibit E; and

Whereas, the 2010 census indicated resident populations of 6,469 in District 1, 13,406 in District 2, and 12,533 in District 3; and

Whereas, as of the 2010 federal Census, population in three board member districts had the following percentages of the total resident population, respectively:

District 1: 19.9%  
District 2: 41.4%  
District 3: 38.7%; and

Whereas, the Board now determines to change the boundaries of the School Corporation's three (3) board member districts in a manner that will result in nearly equal population in all three (3) board member districts; and

Whereas, the Board of School Trustees of the School Corporation now intends, based on the 2010 census, to reduce any population disparity between member districts to less than one percent (1%) over or under-representation from the ideal of three (3) board member districts with equal population as indicated on Exhibit E; and

Whereas, the descriptions of the three board member districts as proposed to be modified and as described by enumeration of precincts to be included within each board member district, as such precincts were certified by the Mayor of Indianapolis, filed with the Indiana Election Commission on November 17, 2011 and became effective on January 1, 2012, remain effective as of this date, and are attached as Exhibit F; and

Whereas, a map depicting the three (3) board member districts as restructured is attached as Exhibit G; and

Whereas, the board organization requirements of the Community School Corporation statute, IC 20-23-4-7(c)(2), are also met by the School Corporation's restructured board member districts;

Now Therefore Be It Resolved that the following three board member school board districts be restructured, and be as described in Exhibit F;

Be It Further Resolved that if there is any conflict between the new restructured board member district boundaries described in Exhibit F, and the map depicting the restructured boundaries in Exhibit G, the precinct designations in Exhibit F shall control in accordance with IC 20-23-4-35(k);

Be It Therefore Resolved that the boundaries of said board member districts be changed from the existing board member districts described in narrative form in attached Exhibit C and Depicted on the Map, attached as Exhibit D, to the board member districts described by enumerated precincts in Exhibit F, and depicted on the map depicted in Exhibit G;

Be It Further Resolved that the Secretary is authorized and directed to file a copy of the modified board member district plan, with attached Exhibit F which describes restructured board member districts by precinct designations and attached Exhibit G, a map depicting restructured board member districts, in accordance with IC 20-23-4-35(h) to the State Board of Education and the Marion County Circuit Court;

Be it further resolved that the Superintendent or his designees, including school counsel, be authorized to take any action required to effect the redistricting described above, including, but not limited to compliance with any other applicable law or State Board of Education rule or

regulation applicable to the redistricting of the School Corporation's three (3) board member districts.

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**NOTICE OF ADOPTION OF PRELIMINARY RESOLUTION FOR  
THE CREATION OF THE METROPOLITAN SCHOOL DISTRICT  
OF DECATUR TOWNSHIP, MARION COUNTY, INDIANA.**

The undersigned Trustees hereby causes notice to be given to the registered voters resident of Decatur Township, and all other persons who may have an interest therein, that on February 23d, 1954, at a special meeting of the Advisory Board of Decatur Township, Marion County, Indiana, the following resolution was adopted by said Advisory Board and the Trustees:

"BE IT RESOLVED, That pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 226 of the Acts of the General Assembly of Indiana, Acts 1949, as added by Acts 1953, Ch. 151, Section 1, as amended, a Metropolitan School District to be known as 'The Metropolitan School District of Decatur Township, Marion County, Indiana,' shall be created, having the same boundaries as the Decatur School Township (which are coextensive with the territory of the entire Civil Township), which school township shall be abolished by operation of law upon the creation of said Metropolitan School District, which shall be created and come into existence on July 1, 1954.

"BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the first Metropolitan Board of Education shall be composed of five members to be created in accordance with the provisions of sub-sections VII and VIII of Section 27 of said act and that all such subsequent boards be elected for a term of office not longer than four (4) years, but in accordance with the provisions of section 10, and any other applicable sections of such act, or such supplementary thereto, or as the same may be amended from time to time; that after the creation of said Metropolitan School District as provided herein, such district shall be divided into three (3) board member districts described as follows, to-wit:

"DISTRICT 1- All of that area of land lying within such Metropolitan School District which lies within the present Civil Township boundary line commencing at a point in the North line of Sec. 25, Twp. 18N, R. 2E, where Interstate Highway I 465 intersects the same, thence eastwardly upon and along the present north Civil Township boundary line to White River; thence southwesterly following said north Civil Township boundary line to a point where I 465 crosses said White River; thence westwardly following the center line of said I 465 through the curve thereof and continuing northwardly along such center line as aforesaid to the point of beginning.

"DISTRICT 2 - All of that area of land lying within such Metropolitan School District which lies within the present Civil Township boundary line commencing at the Southwest Corner of Sec. 25, Twp. 18N, R. 2E, thence eastwardly upon and along the present civil township boundary line to White River; thence north-

easterly following said present civil township boundary line to a point where Interstate I 465 crosses such White River; thence westwardly following the center line of said I 465 through the curve thereof to a point therein where Indiana State Highway #67 intersects the same; thence southwesterly following the center line of said State Highway #67 to a point where it is intersected by a county highway known as Mendenhall Road; thence southwardly following the center line of said Mendenhall Road to a point where such road veers to the east; thence on south following the section line dividing sections 14 and 15 in Twp. 14N, R 2E, to where it meets a county highway known as Paddock Road, and thence continuing southwardly following the center line of said Paddock Road to the point of beginning.

"DISTRICT 3 - All of that area of land lying within such Metropolitan School District which lies within the present Civil Township boundary line commencing at the Southwest Corner of such Civil Township, thence eastwardly upon and along the present civil township boundary line to the center of a county highway known as Paddock Road; thence northwardly following the center line of said Paddock Road and extending into a county highway known as Mendenhall Road and continuing northwardly to a point where it is intersected by Indiana State Highway #67; thence northeasterly following the center line of said State Highway #67 to a point where it is intersected by Interstate I 465; thence northwesterly through the curve of said I 465, following the center line thereof, and continuing thereupon to the north boundary line of such civil township; thence west upon and along said civil township boundary line to the west line of said township; thence south upon and along the west boundary line of said civil township to the point of beginning.

"BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that one (1) member of each Metropolitan Board of Education hereafter elected to such office shall reside within each of such Board Member Districts, but no more than two (2) shall reside in any one (1) Board Member District. All members of such office shall be voted upon by all the registered voters of the Metropolitan School District voting at any school board member election. Candidates, who may succeed themselves for such offices, shall be resident freeholders of the Metropolitan School District; shall be at least thirty (30) years of age and shall be compensated for their services as board members, as is provided by the applicable provisions of such act, or any supplementary act or acts pertaining thereto. They shall also have been continuous residents for three (3) years."

On the thirtieth (30th) day following the date of last publication of this notice, if no protest has been filed with the Advisory Board, the Trustees and a majority of the Advisory Board shall confirm the said preliminary resolution.

STATE COMMISSION FOR THE REORGANIZATION OF SCHOOL CORPORATIONS

IN THE MATTER OF THE CREATION OF  
A COMMUNITY SCHOOL CORPORATION OUT  
OF THE METROPOLITAN SCHOOL DISTRICT  
OF DECATUR TOWNSHIP, MARION COUNTY,  
INDIANA

WHEREAS, The State Commission for the Reorganization of School Corporation, (the "State Commission") created under the School Corporation Reorganization Act of 1959, Chapter 202,, as amended, (the "Act") determined by its own motion on March 18, 1963, that the Metropolitan School District of Decatur Township, Marion County, Indiana, an existing local school corporation in the State of Indiana (the "School Corporation") should be declared a Community School Corporation in accordance with Section 6a of the Act; and,

WHEREAS, the creation of said Community School Corporation under said Act makes no change in its territorial boundaries or in its governing body; and

WHEREAS, the State Commission after due notice as required by Section 6a of the Act held a hearing on such petition on April 20, 1963, in Marion County, where the school corporation is located; and

WHEREAS, the State Commission hereby finds that the creation of a Community School Corporation out of the School Corporation is consistent with the standards set up pursuant to the provisions of the Act as modified by Section 6a of the Act.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the State Commission hereby declares that a Community School Corporation (the "Community School Corporation") be and the same is hereby formed out of the School Corporation in accordance with the following provisions:

(a) The name of the Community School Corporation shall be the "Metropolitan School District of Decatur Township".

(b) The boundaries of the Community School Corporation shall be coterminous with the boundaries of the School Corporation, as of the date it comes into being.

(c) The Community School Corporation shall come into being on July 1, 1963.

(d) The members of the governing body of the School Corporation in office on July 1, 1965, shall constitute the board of school trustees of the Community School Corporation until their successors are qualified; the terms of their respective offices and board membership on the board of school trustees of the Community School Corporation shall be the same as it would have been on the governing body of the School Corporation; and their successors shall be elected or appointed at the same time, in the same manner with the same terms and with the same qualifications as provided in the statutes governing the election or appointment of members of the governing body of the School Corporation.

(e) In the event there is any conflict between the terms of this resolution and the Act, the terms of the Act shall control and to this extent the terms of this resolution are declared to be severable.

DISTRICT 1: All of the area of land lying within such Metropolitan School District which lies within the present Decatur Civil Township boundary lines, and which is described as follows: Commencing at a point in the North line of Sec. 29, Twp. 15N, R 3E, where Indiana State Highway #67 intersects the same, thence eastwardly upon and along the present north boundary line of the Decatur Civil Township to the Northeast corner of said Civil Township; thence in a southerly direction following the present east boundary line of the Decatur Civil Township to a point where Interstate Highway I 465 crosses said east Civil Township boundary line in White River; thence westwardly upon and along the center line of said Interstate Highway I 465 to its point of intersection with the center line of the county highway known as Mann Road; thence continuing upon and along said center line of Interstate Highway I 465 as it curves in a northwesterly direction to a point where Indiana State Highway #67 intersects the same; thence northeastwardly upon and along the center line of Indiana State Highway #67 to the point of beginning in the north boundary line of Decatur Civil Township.

DISTRICT 2: All of that area of land lying within such Metropolitan School District which lies within the present Decatur Civil Township boundary lines and which is described as follows: Commencing at the Southwest Corner of Sec. 23, Twp. 14N, R 2E, thence Eastwardly upon and along the present south boundary line of the Decatur Civil Township to the east boundary line of said Civil Township in White River; thence Northeastwardly following said present east boundary line of said Decatur Civil Township to a point where Interstate Highway I 465 crosses said east line in White River; thence westwardly upon and along the center line of said Interstate Highway I 465 to its point of intersection with the center line of the county highway known as Mann Road; thence continuing upon and along said center line of Interstate Highway I 465 as it curves in a northwesterly direction to a point thereon where the center line of Indiana State Highway #67 intersects the same; thence northeastwardly upon and along the center line of said Indiana State Highway #67 to a point where it is intersected by the center line of the county highway known as Hanna Avenue; thence

DISTRICT 3: All of that area of land lying within such Metropolitan School District which lies within the present Decatur Civil Township boundary lines and which is described as follows: Commencing at the Southwest Corner of such Civil Township, thence eastwardly upon and along the present south boundary line of said civil township to the center of the county highway known as Paddock Road; thence northwardly upon and along the center line of said Paddock Road to the point of its intersection with the center line of the county highway known as Mooresville Road; thence north-eastwardly upon and along the center line of said Mooresville Road to the point of its intersection with the center line of the county highway known as Presley Street in the unincorporated town of West Newton, Indiana;

thence northwardly upon and along the center line of said Presley Street to the point of its intersection with the center line of the county highway known as Mendenhall road; thence northwestwardly upon and along the center line of said Mendenhall Road to the point where said Road veers to the north; thence northwardly upon and along the center line of said Mendenhall Road to the point of its intersection with the center line of the county highway known as Thompson Road; thence eastwardly upon and along the center line of said Thompson Road to the point of its intersection with the center line of Indiana State Highway #67; thence northeastwardly upon and along the center line of said Indiana State Highway #67 to the point of its intersection with the center line of the county highway known as High School Road; thence northwardly upon and along the center line of said High School Road to the point where said Road jogs to the east; thence eastwardly upon and along the center line of said High School Road to the point where said road resumes its northwardly course; thence northwardly upon and along the center line of said High School Road to the point of its intersection with the center line of the county highway known as Hanna Avenue; thence eastwardly upon and along the center line of said Hanna Avenue to the point of its intersection with the center line of Indiana State Highway #67; thence northeastwardly upon and along the center line of said Indiana State Highway #67 to the point where it is intersected by the north line of Sec. 29, Twp. 15N, R 3E; thence west upon and along the present north boundary line of said Decatur Civil Township to the west line of said Township; thence south upon and along the west boundary line of said Township to the point of beginning.




