





PRIORITY #1

Goal: Modernize campus for safety, efficiency, and growth

- Renovate and modernize to allow collaboration and shared space for the Schools of Health Sciences & Nursing
- Expand School of Advanced Manufacturing Engineering and Applied Sciences by moving Nursing to main campus
- Demo two buildings constructed in 1967 and 1985 and replace with a new building to house remaining Schools

Total Cost: \$67,140,311

Estimated Cost Savings: \$40,000 annually GSF Reduction: 11,661





EVANSVILLE

PRIORITY #2

Goal: Realign campus to meet student and workforce needs

- Construct new School of Health Sciences
- Repurpose existing spaces for Industry 4.0 and Entrepreneurship labs
- Expand of Automotive Lab

Total Cost: \$34,999,910

Estimated Cost Savings: \$203,872 annually

GSF Addition: 69,363


