New Business

Infinite Resources – Tax Abatement Request and Resolution 1123-2020

Melanie Kellogg of Region 3a attended on behalf of Infinite Resources who they are assisting with a tax abatement for personal property for the business they are opening in Ligonier. They are re-purposing pellet machinery for a new ice melt bagging facility. Used equipment from out of state and a conveyor system will be purchased. The total amount of the equipment is \$149,000.

At the November 10, 2020 meeting of the Redevelopment Commission meeting, the commission approved Resolution RDC1110-2020A and is recommending the council tax abatement for Infinite Resources.
