The next step is through the Indiana Bond bank to start the process of application and give authority of his office to submit the application and President Carruthers to sign the application outside of the meeting. The Bond amount is \$1,500,000.00.

Don Lopp stated Buildings 1 & 2 are in the final stages. He attended the RDA meeting and they came out with their methodology and processes for Buildings 3 & 4, laboratory buildings. Originally, the County requested \$5.5 million and they received 52% of what was requested. He will get with the architects and present to the Commissioners what they can do with \$2.7 million.

The construction of road on the north side of the railroad is progressing with a November timeframe.

Altawood and Buffalo Trail will have a public meeting for their sanitary sewer Wednesday, June 8 at the library.

Floyds Knobs Water will start their water improvement project for Altawood and Buffalo Trace. Edwardsville Water submitted their items to the State for their water tower.

a. United Consulting Bridge 51 Update

Jon Clodfelter of United Consulting gave an update on Bridge 51, Blackiston Mill Bridge. Last fall a hole was discovered in the deck of the bridge. They did a thorough inspection of the bridge. They will have a proposal to do temporary repairs to keep the bridge open until it is replaced. The bridge could be closed for 4-6 weeks for the repairs.

Councilman Danny Short stated he is a member of Northside Christian Church and a frequent visitor of Kevin Hammersmith Park. He has been meeting with members of Northside and New Albany Little League to discuss the parking situation. He would like to encourage the Commissioners to keep the communication open and keep an open mind on the best solution for the parking. He outlined why putting the additional parking down low, across from Northside, is the better option, in his opinion. It maintains the greenspace at the top, behind the maintenance shed, and increases the park by 2 acres. It will creates more places to park visually instead of going in to the Northside lot. Visitors will not be aware of the lot behind the maintenance shed. There is a lot of Community involved with constructing the lot across from Northside. He stated he has spoken with majority of the County Council and they would pledge \$100,000.00 toward the engineering cost contingent upon that the Commissioners contribute money toward the paving. His concern is if they paved up top they lose the greenspace forever and in a few years, Little League still add the parking lot across from Northside.
