IN THE MATTER OF NEW BUSINESS:

Approval of county abatements for 2024 paid 2025 form CF1 for MB real estate leasing as well as 2024-page 2025 form CF1 for Merill Brothers, these need Council approval.

Councilman Faulkner made a motion to approve County Amendments as read; Councilman Maple seconded the motion, and the motion carried.

COUNCIL BUSINESS:

Councilman Sanders states, "We had the good opportunity to go to the State Convention this past Friday and Saturday for the Indiana County Council Association and enjoyed spending time with a number of my colleagues here and ones from around the state. I felt like they had a really good productive conversation we got to meet with the representative Jeff Thompson, who's co-chair with Travis Holdman the Senator for the state local and tax revenue task force I felt like they did a really good job of presenting some of the challenges that local governments have as well as the state have regarding revenue, also representative Jim Pressel he's the chair of the house roads and transportation committee we talked, one of the things that he highlighted was just for an example was with the gas tax cars with new car standards no longer have the same they have greater efficiency than they used to so the revenue that's produced from that fund is no longer what it used to be so there's we have to think of ways to be creative and how to capture new forms of Revenue so it was neat to hear his perspective and how that affects our County we had a lively discussion regarding Luke Britt, he's from the Indiana Public Asset Counselor about some of the challenges that communities have regarding Open Door Laws decorum and some of the technology that's now coming in that will be changing January 1st. I enjoyed Elise Nieshalla the State Comptroller, she had a really good report on the state finances which fortunately we're in really good shape as a state compared to others. Some of the plans that we have going forward on how to be able to maintain that and provide greater opportunities for our residents. So that's some of the highlights we had a good fireside chat from some of the county auditors. I appreciated the opportunity to be there and to go represent the county".

Council President Roberts also expressed, "It was a good day, it was nice to be down there we had a good representation from Howard County. I to enjoyed it and I thought that we may have our own challenges here is Howard County. We wonder if the state is listening to us as we request their help and assistance and guidance. What I came away with is that representative Thompson and Senator Holdman these are men who are salt to the earth, they're humble, they're knowledgeable and they are trying their best to solve these complex problems in a fair manner. I left there with a sigh of relief, I fell I can trust these people and they are doing a good job. I was very comforted by the people who are serving us at the state level."

Councilwoman Lake follows President Robert's statement with, "It was, and there's always something new every year, such as how they talked about the open-door law with the new changes. After the legislators meet there's always new changes and new challenges. It was so wonderful and again the confidence we can have in our state leaders is very inspiring to us. This is because sometimes we can feel like we are out here by ourselves but they actually seem to know what's going on and show they care".

Councilman Faulkner shares, "So, several of the County Council members know that I helped facilitate a group called the Howard County GOP breakfast club. This past Thursday morning we had an absolutely wonderful presentation by Captain Jordan Buckley and it was about technology on patrol. In Howard County with the use of drones and how drones can be used effectively to find people, maybe an Alzheimer's person who is lost in the wood it can find escape people and compliments to Captain Buckley, he did a fantastic job very interesting and bunch of retired engineers that like technology really appreciated the presentation and the capabilities that are using and interestingly he said they have to be certified by the FAA to be pilots for the drones. These drones are not toys and are very capable of finding people quickly. So, very excellent presentation by Captain Buckley and we greatly appreciate our County Sheriff's Department. He also told me, he was going to call it the T.O.P. program, which stands for Technology On Patrol."

There being no further business to come before the Council at this time, the meeting was adjourned at 4:53 p.m. on a motion made by Councilman Faulkner. Councilman Sanders seconded the motion, and the motion carried.
