HOWARD COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS' MEETING: JUNE 03, 2024

The Howard County Board of Commissioners met in Regular Session on Monday, June 3rd, 2024, at 4:00 p.m. in Hearing Room 338 of the Howard County Administration Center. Those in attendance included Commissioner President Jack Dodd, Commissioner Vice President Brad Bray, Commissioner Member Jeff Lipinski, County Attorney Alan Wilson, and County Auditor Jessica Secrease.

The meeting was called to order by Sheriff Jerry Asher and conducted by President Dodd. Commissioner President Dodd led the Pledge of Allegiance, and Commissioner Lipinski offered a word of prayer.

SPEACIAL ANNOUCEMENT/RECOGNITIONS:

Employee of the Month - Kari Rennaker

On January 29th 2024 while conducting his duties in Superior Court 2 Steve Arnold was tasked with escorting a mental health court participant, to look up after being found to be in direct contempt of court for non-compliance with program rules in the area of the third floor between Superior 2 and Superior 4. The individual, while handcuffed, decided to resist by trying to pull away from Steven, and made an attempt to jump over the third-floor railing. Steven prevented this from happening and as a result suffered a broken thumb, which required surgery and time off from work. Steven's credit he saved this individual's life and should be commended for his actions, for this reason he was nominated for employee of the month.

Howard County Mass Fatality Plan

- 2. **Payroll Expenses:** The Commissioners' Payroll Expenses for payment on May 31st, 2024, in the amounts of \$1,115,500.73 were submitted and approved as presented on a motion made by Commissioner Bray to approve. Commissioner Lipinski seconded the motion, and the motion carried.
- 3. **Operating Claims:** The Commissioners' Operating Claims to be paid on May 17th, 2024, in the amount of \$452,289.82 was submitted and approved as presented on a motion made by Commissioner Bray to approve. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Lipinski, and the motion carried.

COUNTY ATTORNEY ISSUES:

Attorney Alan Wilson presented Ordinance No. 2024-BCCO-27 Fund 9144. This grant fund of \$24,500 has been awarded to Howard Heaven. A motion made by Commissioner Lipinski to approve Ordinance No. 2024-BCCO-27. Commissioner Bray seconded the motion, and the motion carried.

Attorney Alan Wilson also presented an agreement for contract Services between the Commissioners and Gabrielle Dupuy for assistance with the American Rescue plan report. This is on an hourly basis until the report is completed. A motion made by Commissioner Lipinski to approve contract Services between the Commissioners and Gabrielle Dupuy. Commissioner Bray seconded the motion, and the motion carried.

Attorney Alan Wilson proposed a third amendment to the agreement for Cooperative action between the city and the county, this third amendment allows the state through INDA to have a vote by proxy. A motion made by Commissioner Lipinski to approve the amendment. Commissioner Bray seconded the motion, and the motion carried.

Attorney Alan Wilson presented a road plan for Amber Tolle in her absence. This was previously passed at the 05.20.2024 meeting, it only needs signed by Commissioner President Dodd.

There being no further business to come before the Board of Commissioners at this time the meeting was adjourned at 4:25 p.m. on a motion made by Commissioner Lipinski.
