Mid-States Corridor / Bill Kaiser

Kaiser presented a chart showing a summary of the five (5) preliminary routes being considered for the new expressway that would run from l-64 North to l-69 South of Indianapolis. The five (5) routes are being identified as single letters: B, C, M, O, and P.

Alt B joins with I-69 near Washington. The 34-mile-long route passes Huntingburg and Jasper to the west before eventually connecting to the I-69 at a new interchange which is directly south of U.S. 50 Interchange.

route runs for 42 miles. Alt Calso connects to I-69 through the U.S. 50 Interchange. This includes a section of U.S. 50 to the east. This

Alt M travels North, passing Huntingburg and Jasper to the east before joining State Road 37 near Bedford.

passes Loogootee to the east before winding its way to I-69. Alt P extends through the heart of Dubois County, eventually connecting I-69 through the U.S. 231 exchange. This route passes through Huntingburg and Jasper by continuing northward. The 54-mile-long route briefly
