

**Surveyors Report**



Faulkenberg reported that Herron Excavating is 90% complete on the Huffman REO Lateral project across from the high school. He states it appears this work will alleviate a major portion of the flooding at the fire station lot and roads in the area.

Faulkenberg states the public hearing for the Muddy Creek Watershed will be held February 6<sup>th</sup>, 2020 in the Commissioners room at 6:00 P.M. The Drainage Advisory Board was held January 14<sup>th</sup>, 2020. All in attendance agreed to go forward with establishing new watersheds which will require going to the County Council and requesting funding on each watershed. Faulkenberg states the dollar amount has not been determined.

Faulkenberg states he visited the Garrett Creek site that was discussed in the January meeting. He states he walked the ditch from the Ketcham property to the open field behind Flat Ridge Trucking. He states there are a few small obstructions in the ditch. Faulkenberg states there are multiple issues in that area. County Road 150S is a minimum of two feet higher in elevation than the yard with no functioning culvert under the driveway, water drainage from the west under the neighbor's driveway overflows the lane into the Ketcham's property. East of Ketcham's property the pipes in neighbor's yard are not large enough to handle the capacity of water exiting the Ketcham's property. The creek is running at capacity which creates a dam to water flowing from Ketcham's property which causes retention and flooding. When water reaches the culvert under the road, which is approximately 150 feet, east of Ketcham's property the culvert will not handle capacity of water which causes overflow of County Road 150 S and creates more of a water retention problem.

Seiler made a motion to adjourn. Logsdon seconded the motion, motion approved.
