#### Minutes

### Surveyors Report

Faulkenberg reported that Huffman Phase 1 has not begun due to high water and the ground conditions. He reports Huffman Phase 2 will be complete at the of today barring any unforeseen circumstances. Faulkenberg states the Lechner Construction has a long reach track hoe in the Huffman area and an agreement has been made to clean Anderson River log jams when the water and ground conditions are favorable. Faulkenberg states that 15,000 feet of approximately 225,000 feet of ditches have been sprayed. Faulkenberg stated the Warrick County Surveyor reported that Pigeon Creek log jams have not been removed due to the high water and ground conditions.

### New Business

Brown states between now and budget time a decision needs to be made on which drainage area needs to be addressed next. Brown believes that one drain at a time should be approached. Faulkenberg will advise at the next meeting as to which drain he believes needs to be addressed

Mr. Al Perdue presented a concern with road flooding and personal property flooding from a ditch south out of Country Ridge Estates and north on highway 66. This is a tributary of Huffman Drain. Mr. Kenny Coultas from INDOT states the drain on the north side of Hwy 66 seems to be the problem and needs cleaned. Randy Herron states he believes that there needs to be a bigger culvert. Herron also states he has pictures of the flooding that occurs. Coultas states that he will file a report with an INDOT engineer for this area to be addressed.

Logsdon made a motion to adjourn. Seiler seconded the motion, motion approved. Meeting was adjourned at 2:08 P.M.
