Guidebook for Best Practices with Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender, and Questioning (LGBTQ) Youth

The Indiana Department of Child Services is committed to meeting the needs of all children, youth and families it serves. Because of the unique needs of youth who identify as LGBTQ, it is vital that social services staff ensure all placements and services are safe and supportive. It is the expectation that providers and staff treat all individuals and families respectfully and non-judgmentally, irrespective of one's personal views of sexual orientation and/or gender identity. Social work best practice dictates that staff be aware of personal biases in order to ensure that equitable services are provided to all individuals and families.
