Adding NFPA 13-R sprinkler system throughout the building to eliminate the need for the first variance request. Still requesting no requirement for one-hour fire separation.

iii. **24-03-24 Downstairs Security Door (Evansville)** – Asking for locked door in area with children. Dead end corridor, 35 feet long. 60-80 children in the facility per day. Area not regularly used for child care, used as pass-through for gymnasium. Wanting to secure the area to prevent unauthorized area. Other exits from the hallway. Access control only on door leading into child care area. Access control system tied into fire alarm and sprinkler system, smoke detector and pull station located in same area. Magnetic lock used. Plans on DFBS not correct plans. Proponent showed correct plans via shared screen. Worship area sprinklered, 1987 edition is not. Ministry day care. Lisa West, Director of Child Care, noted that church is a registered ministry, so there is oversight from the state. Area not originally purposed for child

care. Discussion was had about adding a delayed egress door with an alarm as an alternative to the discussed security recommendations. Dave Cook notes that mag lock cannot be put on delayed egress device, and that pull station generally only operates magnetic lock, not delayed egress. Tabled until more detailed information can be provided from Sonitrol to see if current proposal is workable.

i. 24-04-43(a)(b) Hangar 814 (Indianapolis) – Requesting fire suppression system per NFPA 409 2022 edition. Forwarded to the Commission because requesting use of a newer edition of the code. Also asking for high-expansion foam system to require manual activation instead of automatic activation. LFO is not opposed, but IDHS did not receive comment before forwarding to Commission. Christina Collester presented. Foam systems incredibly expensive and easy to activate on automatic systems, foam corrosive to plane environment, must be removed and treated as hazardous waste. Air force found that wet pipe system design good to address all fires, fuel spills do not usually create fires, collected underneath hangar to be treated as hazardous waste. Latest edition allows for hazard risk analysis to allow for water-only system.

LFO has indicated that they are not in support of variance. When variance filed proponent believed that building was over area, but is actually within allowable area for S1 occupancy. Steel building with wood frame, allowable area 13,500 square feet, current building area. Originally part of a lumber yard. Change of use may negate the need for a variance. Commission discussed whether that would be the appropriate use. Tabled while proponent gets letter from water company demonstrating that water company is forcing change and unwilling to work with owner. Untabled after proponent provided copy of letter from water utility.

Commissioner Cook suggested adding an exit next to overhead door.
