Background:

Respondent was issued an off-cycle audit of continuing education, after a report of failure to collect continuing education for the license cycle of 02/05/2021 to 03/29/2023. The respondent submitted continuing education hours but was requested to submit further proof of documentation for validation. Respondent did not respond to the request for supplemental information for six (6) days. Request was sent to respondent again on sixth day, and respondent replied via email with the request/statement below.

"Thank you for touching base. I submitted a note over the weekend that indicated since I am no longer working as a paramedic, I do not need to maintain my Indiana certification."

Pursuant to IC 16-31-3-14(o), (o) A certificate holder may not surrender the certificate holder's certificate, and a license holder may not surrender the license holder's license, without the written approval of the department of homeland security, and the department of homeland security may impose any conditions appropriate to the surrender or reinstatement of a surrendered certificate or license.

IDHS Proposed Terms on Surrender:

- A surrender is akin to a revocation in that both the EMT certification and paramedic licensure would be surrendered or "cancelled" meaning that licensure would not exist from the date of surrender. There is no opportunity to reacquire the certification/licensure by the retest procedure.
- 2. Following this surrender Mr. Clase may reapply for any EMS certification/licensure by completing all the requirements necessary for a new applicant, this means completing course training, written and psychomotor testing.
