Educator Pipeline (Attract, Prepare, Retain)

Indiana Commission for Higher Education's Next Generation Hoosier Educators Scholarship Application Now Available

The Commission for Higher Education is accepting applications for the <u>Next Generation Hoosier</u> <u>Educators Scholarship</u> and the Next Generation Hoosier Minority Educators Scholarship, which provide up to \$40,000 of financial aid to aspiring teachers. High-achieving high school and college students who plan to teach in Indiana for at least five years can receive up to \$10,000 per year of college (up to \$40,000 total) from the scholarship. Current college students who apply must be able to use the scholarship for at least two full academic years. Students must apply by Wednesday, January 31, at <u>ScholarTrack.IN.gov</u>. Students who apply for both the Next Generation Hoosier Educators Scholarship and the Next Generation Hoosier Minority Educators Scholarship can only be selected for one of the awards. Indiana STEM Educator Expansion Program (I-STEM) Registration Now Available

IDOE has announced a partnership with Educational Service Centers of Indiana (ESCI) to strengthen Indiana's STEM educator pipeline. The I-STEM partnership provides support for both currently licensed teachers in non-STEM areas and prospective teachers who are not licensed and hold a bachelor's degree to become licensed in a STEM content area. IDOE has identified eligible STEM content areas as life science, chemistry, earth/space science, physics, physical science, computer science, technology education, and mathematics. Apply for the ILEARN U.S. Government Standards/Cut Score Confirmation Committee

IDOE invites current teachers, instructional coaches, and curriculum leaders with expertise in required content and skills for the high school U.S. Government course to apply for the <u>ILEARN U.S. Government</u> <u>Standards/Cut Score Confirmation Committee</u>. This committee will convene virtually on Thursday, February 22, to review the current cut scores for the ILEARN U.S. Government End-of-Course Assessment (ECA) to ensure alignment to the 2023 future-focused Indiana Academic Standards. Committee participants will receive a \$160 honorarium and Professional Growth Plan (PGP) points for their participation. ILEARN Released Items Repository (RIR) Refresh & Test Administrator's Manual (TAM)

Newly-released items for ILEARN 3-8 English/Language Arts, Mathematics, and Social Studies become available in the <u>RIR</u> on Wednesday, January 17. Students may access the RIR via the <u>Indiana</u> <u>Assessment Portal</u> to review released test items for additional practice and familiarity with testing. The <u>2023-2024 ILEARN TAM</u> is now available on the Indiana Assessment Portal. This resource combines the previously-separated ILEARN 3-8, Biology ECA, and U.S. Government ECA manuals into one resource. Staff should review the TAM prior to administering practice and operational assessments, as there are significant changes to the *Scheduling and Timing Guidance* section. 
